In the name of God Amen the 2 day of February in the year of our Lord 1811 James Wilborn of Barren County and late of Kentucky being sick in body but sound in mind are desirous that my last Will and Testament should be made and I have made and signed this my last Will and Testament that is to say firstly and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul to God that he will have it and my body to be buried to be buried at the discretion of my friends not looking at the resurrection to receive it again by the mighty power of God and touching such worldly Estate as God has & which I have acquired by my own labor and the blessing of my friends I give and Recommend that all my lawful Debts be paid out of my Estate with my personal property and I am first of all I give and Recommend unto my grandson Samuel Wilborn containing seventy acres with the Spring of Water and improvements according to Survey I give the said land to a young man and a Saddle and a Rifle gun one feather bed and furniture one horse and one large powder Dish two Barrels one plate and my Diamond Watch and all my plate and two pair of Chains one box and coffee. Then I give and Recommend unto my Well Beloved Wife Isabel Wilborn all and every part of my Estate and property that I have not already will to be at her disposal and use during her natural life and at her decease what is left to be sold and every Child have an equal part and I appoint and Ordain my son Samuel and Joshua Wilborn my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and my son Joshua a Guardian to take care of my Grandson with what I have left him till he is of age and capable of taking it to himself and hereby I do revoke all Wills made by me heretofore and hereby I confirm this to be my last Will and Testament in Witness Whereof I have set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
