

402 November 4th 1825 Know all men by these presents that I Hugh McCombs of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth McCombs all Combs in manner and form as follows To wit, after all my just debts are paid I give unto my wife all my stocks of horses cattle sheep and hogs. Also all my household and Kitchen furniture, and also, my tract of land, whereon I now live, and all and singular and all and singular advantages pertaining thereto, to raise my children on, that are with me after the death of my wife Elizabeth, it is my will and desire that my above written tract of land should be equally divided between my two youngest sons, namely Hugh McCombs and James McCombs. And further I appoint my Executors, Archabal Miller, and David Lock this this, my last Will and Testament, In Testament whereof I have hereunto affix, my hand and seal in presents of us,

In the name of God Amen, I James Edmunds, son of Barren County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following (To wit) first I desire that my wife Polly Edmunds should have full and peaceable possession of all the property that I possess, during her lifetime, and then to be divided in the manner and form following (To wit) The Plantations and tract of land that I now live on, I give devise and bequeath, to Alexander Edmunds and Francis Combs as Trustees for the benefit of my son John Edmunds his lifetime and at his death, to be to property of his daughter Betty Edmunds. Also I give to the said Betty Edmunds, one Negro girl named Lucy also to my son James Edmunds I give and bequeath one Negro boy, named Thomas, and one bed and furniture. Also to my daughter Sally Edmunds I give and bequeath one Negro girl, named Rachel, and one trunk covered with skin. Also my son Alexander Edmunds I have given him what, and all that I intend for him (viz) one Negro girl and some other property, which I think to be fully his part; The balance of my property I wish at the death of my wife, to be sold and equally divided among all my children, except Alexander Edmunds, (as before stated) And the part that comes to my daughter Betty Combs I wish and bequeath unto her son James

403 Cooney. I also give unto my son Henry one cow and calf, one trunk and her two beds and furniture, the balance of my property as above stated to be sold and equally divided between my children (viz) my daughter Betty Edmunds, Betty Cooney, her part to her son James Cooney, James Edmunds, William Edmunds, Sally Edmunds, John Edmunds and Nancy Bates. I also wish and appoint Mr. Nathaniel P. Bates, and James Cooney Executors of my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twentieth day of July in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty four, James Edmunds
