my last Will and Testament
I wish and it is my Will and desire that all my just debts
be paid and that for the purpose of discharging the same my
Executors herein after named do sell and dispose of at such time or
times & upon such terms as they may deem prudent

and dependent to such my property as may be sufficient for that purpose
and if my property may be sold for the purpose
my said Executors should have power to discharge my debts the
same sum to be disposed of according to my Will hereafter expressed and also
it may happen that the property I may die and property may not be sufficient
to pay all my just debts if such should be the case it is my Will & desire
that such of them as may remain unpaid shall be discharged out
of my share of my mother's Estate after her death

And it is my Will and desire that all the property either real or personal
of what I may die and I bequeath to which may have my
right claim a little in remainder or otherwise shall be equally divided
among my two Sisters that is to say Eliza B. Cadbury Susanah B.
Cadbury my two half Brothers John Henry Glazbrook and Isaac Glazbrook
Glazbrook and the Infant that I have all bequeathed now living and next to
them and to their heirs forever Share & Share alike and if any of my property
bequeathed to my said half Brothers and the Infant not yet born or
cannot in the opening of my bequest be conveniently divided
divided among them without sale it is my desire that my bequest
be sold to the best advantage according to their discretion and divided
thereof equally among my Sisters and half Brothers and the in-
fant and at option
