as to such worldly Estate where with God hath blessed
me I dispose of the same as follows To wit I give
and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth two
hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live during her
life likewise to my son Robert ten Shillings likewise
to my Daughter Mary Leeper Wife of James Leeper
ten Shillings also to my son James I give ten
Shillings also to my Daughter Mary Rudy I give
ten Shillings and to my Daughter Anna Scott I give
ten Shillings to my son Wm Gallaway I give one
hundred Acres Land lying on the tract where I now live
on the East side and to my son John Gallaway I give
the obligation that I have on David Childer of three
hundred thirty three and one third Acres of Land and to
my sons Joseph & Samuel Alexander and George Gallo-
way the two hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live
to be Equally Divided Amongst them for at the
Death of the Wife also the obligation that I have on son
Jed Hatcher to be Equally Divided among the four before
mentioned sons To my Daughter Elizabeth I give ten
Shillings and to my Daughter Mary I give ten Shillings
and to my Daughter Mary R I give ten Shillings and
my grand son James Rudy I give as a parting gift
and as all the remainder of my personal Estate I give
to my loving wife Elizabeth Gallaway and at her
disposal Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint
my Dear and loving wife Elizabeth Gallaway &
my well beloved sons William & John Gallaway my
Executors & Executors of this last will and Testament
hereby revoking all former wills by me made &
declaring this to be my last will and Testament

July one thousand eight hundred and one in the County of
Barren and State of Kentucky I James Black Senr being
Weak in body but of perfect sound mind and memory
thanks be to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of the
body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that
it may be Principally and first of all I give & recommend
my Soul into the hands of God that first give it and for
my body I recommend it unto the earth to be buried in a Christ-
ian manner at the discretion of my friends and acquaint-
ing such worldly things as it has pleased God to bestow on me
in this life I give in the following manner and form
that it is my desire that all my just debts be paid and
Satisfied. I then

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Michael
Black the fieldson both sides of the lane leading from the house
to the top of the hill to enclose the house and spring together
to beather with a sufficient quantity of timber for the sup-
port of the farm and firewood to be taken out of any part of
the tract also one half the stock of hogs the big bay mare
bears three yearlings one bed and furniture the kitchen furniture
and barn with its furniture her trunk two sets of beer for
ploughing and one plough all to be for her use and under her
direction During her life time and at her death the land
to be Equally Divided between my two sons James Black and
Robert Black together with rest of the tract of land which
I now live on and the balance of the property she leaves
to be Equally divided between James Black Robert Black
my Daughters Ann Black and Margaret Black. I then
I give and bequeath to my son James Black the pile
on the top of the hill and privilege to clear as much
adjourning as he sees cause I then

plough and two sets of beer before crafted. I then
