I James Kerr of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky do make and deliver this my last Will and Testament in manner form and Substance as followeth to wit
1st I lend unto my son John Kerr one Negro man by this name of John together with two sons & calves one further son and furniture one more during his natural life and at his decease to descend to his children. Also I give unto my said son my Watch and wearing Apparel
2nd I lend unto my Son-in-law Perry B. Butler two Negro Women now in his possession by the names of Rose & Pacy together with their present and future increase likewise one brood sow and one feather Bed & furniture during his natural life and at his decease to descend to the surviving children of his present wife Lucy Butler

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3rd My Will is that my three Negroes by the names of David
Heller & Betty be emancipated and fully liberated from
Slavery according to the laws in that case made and provided
4th I give unto my Son William here one hundred and fifty
Dollars to be paid out of the moneys arising from the sales
of my Estate hereafter mentioned
5th I give unto my Son-in-law Benj & Buster one hundred
Dollars to be paid in like manner
6th My Will is that all the residue of my Estate of whatever value
including Lands Slaves Stock of all kinds Household and
Kitchen furniture Plantations utensils &c to be sold by
my Executors hereafter named on credit of twelve Months
and after paying the foregoing Cash Legacies and all
legal expenses the then remaining balance to be equally
divided between my following named Children to-wit
David New Sarah Thompson, Benj. Burch & John H. New
Lastly I constitute ^{my appoint} Executors and John H. New my
Executors revoking all former Wills by me made
-ing and confirming this to be my last Will and Testament

Seal the twelfth third day of December in the year our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
