Black and my daughter America her wife and their heirs and assigns forever I holding the rightfull ownership my natural lifetime until my Wife give to the said heirs and assigns my family Bible and Song Book to my daughter America black in witness whereof we have set our hands and seal this 3^d day of December 1856
