In the name of God I, James Stephens
son of Glasgow Kentucky being weak in body but sound
in mind and memory do make and constitute this my last
Will and Testament I do give and bequeath unto
my loving wife Elizabeth all the real and personal property which
I may be possessed of for and during her natural life to be
except the sum of fifty pounds which I give and bequeath
unto my son James Stephens out of any money which may

may be coming to me from the State of Virginia which
 Sum my will is that my Executor hereinafter named shall
 do as apply to the use of my said son John Stephens
 in his education: My further Will is that all my just
 Debts shall be paid and if money enough cannot be
 collected out of what is owing to me independent of the
 of fifty Pounds to discharge them, ^{but here} my Executor hereinafter
 named shall have full power and authority and it my
 Will that he shall sell the plantation which I have lately
 purchased of John Shaw lying in the Neighbourhood of
 Glasgow and apply the money arising from the sale thereof
 to the payments of my said Debts and the Surplus if any my
 Will is that he shall pay it over to my said Wife Elizabeth
 Stephens My further Will is that at the death of my
 said Wife Elizabeth Stephens all my property ⁱⁿ and
 personal which I may have in possession or in reversion or
 remainder at my death or which may fall to me after my
 death shall go to my two Daughters Eliza and Stephens and
 Elizabeth Stephens and their Heirs forever and in
 case either of my said Daughters should die without leaving
 a husband or children before my said Wife that the surviving
 Daughter shall possess the whole of ^{the} property and in
 case they should both die before my said Wife then to my
 son John Stephens and in case my said son John should die
 before his mother then to my two Daughters Polly Shelton and
 Robert and Shelton and their Heirs forever
 My further Will is that my Executor hereinafter named shall
 collect all the debts which may be owing to me at my death and
 should there be any Surplus after paying my just Debts it
 shall be paid over by him to my said Wife Elizabeth Stephens
 My further Will is that my Executor shall collect the sum
 of one hundred Dollars from my son James P. Stephens
 and apply it in manner aforesaid
 My further Will is that my said Executor shall apply
 the money arising from the sale of ^{the} ^{the} man now in
 Virginia to my said Wife use till living a Negro by the
 name of Brick my Eldest having a life Estate in said
 Negro and having given me the money arising from his
 hire: My further Will is that all the property which
 may fall to me after my death from the Estate of my
 father shall go to my said Wife for and during her natural
 life and then as before mentioned to my two Daughters

Eliza and Elizabeth or to the Survivor of them should either
 die before my said Wife. My further Will is that should my son
 Samuel Stephens think proper he may keep and enjoy a House
 and lot which I now possess in the Town of Livingston
 County of Madison State of Virginia provided he pay to my Executor
 hereinafter named the sum of five hundred Dollars in three
 equal annual instalments for the use of my said Wife and
 then to my said daughter Eliza and Elizabeth and also
 relinquish his claim to the aforesaid plantation which I
 lately purchased of John Shaw But should my said son not think
 proper to keep said lot under the above condition then my Will
 is that my Executor shall and he is hereby authorised and required
 to sell said lot and to apply the money arising from the sale
 thereof to the use of my said Wife her life and then to my two
 Daughters Eliza and Elizabeth forever
 My further Will is that should George Loving feel to pay up
 for that of Lane containing forty acres of land which he purchased
 in Madison Virginia that the said land shall go to my son
 John Stephens and his Heirs forever But should he pay up to
 my Executor the money which he was to pay for said land my Will
 is that my Executor shall convey to him the same and the money
 arising from it shall go to my wife her life and then to my
 two Daughters Eliza and Elizabeth forever
 My further Will and desire is that I may be buried in said
 form as further and early nomination and order and
 appoint Robinson P. Beauchamp of Warren County My Executor
 to this my last Will and Testament in Testimony
 whereof I subscribe set my name and seal this 25th day of April 1810
