Will I John Goodall of the County of Barnem being in sound senses & memory do make and Ordain this writing to be my last Will & Testament, in manner and form following
I Steer & lend to my loving Wife, Clarissa Goodall the whole of my Negroes one Churn Horse her Saddle and Bridle two Chops two & halfs Two Churn Sheep one Churn Bed & four mixed and such a part of my Household & Kitchen furniture as she shall stand in need of, and as much Corn & Pork or Bacon as will serve her Family one year after my death this property I lend her during her Natural life = I Steer my Will and Desire is that the Ballance of my Estate shall be Divided by Consent of Parties or sold at twelve Months Credit & Divided in manner of sale following to Lodowick Goodall twenty Pounds, To James Goodall twenty Pounds,

17 Turner Goodall twenty Pounds & if there should be any Balance that it shall be Equally divided between Peter & Goodall & Edward Goodall and my three above mentioned sons unless it amounts to forty three pounds I Steer my Will and Desire is that at the Death of my Wife my two old Negroes Molly & Rachel shall have there Chores to live with any of my Children from time to time as they shall see fit and the other of my Negroes shall have there Chores of Masters of my last mentioned sons to be valued to them by three Disinterested Men and their value with the Ballance of the other property lent my wife shall after my above named Children shall have received the above named sum of forty three pounds be Equally divided between Thomas Goodall, Edward Goodall, Peter & Goodall Lodowick Goodall James Goodall
I Steer my further Will & Desire is that if any of my fore mentioned Children should die before they have their Legacy bequeathed them in possession without Lawfull issue there part shall be Equally divided between my Surviving Children = I Steer my Desire is my Estate shall be Inventoried and not appraised and I do appoint my sons Thomas Goodall Edward Goodall Peter & Goodall Goodall James Goodall and Turner Goodall Executors of this my last Will & Testament and no security required requiring all other whomever I have set my hand and seal this 25th day of Feb^y 1815
