Course of human Events a Dissolution of my mortal body
must soon take place and wishing to make such bequest
and Distribution of that earthly Estate with which it
is blessed the Almighty Father of the Universe to
bless me as appears to me just and equitable as hereby
make and Enjoin this as my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following To wit: my Will and Desire
is that all my just Debts be peaceably paid & for that
purpose that after reserving so much of my Stock as
my Executors shall deem sufficient for the use of my beloved
Wife Eleanor Holliday James & Robert Campbell
& Miss Brown the Residue shall be sold at Publick sale on
a Credit of twelve months the Purchaser or Purchasers
giving to my Executors bond with sufficient security for
the Payment of the Purchase money and after paying
my just Debts and defraying my Funeral Expenses my
Will and Desire further is that my beloved Brother Biwell
Holliday of Virginia State and County of Southampton
or whomever else he or they may reside shall have and
Absolute & Complete right to one full third part or half
of all my Estate both real and Personal and that the
same shall vest on him or his Heirs immediately
after my Death and that the other third or half
of my said Estate shall be disposed of in the following
manner To wit: to be equally divided between my
beloved Wife Eleanor Holliday her son James & Robert
Campbell Miss Brown only that my beloved Wife
Eleanor Holliday shall immediately after my death be

vested with an Absolute right in the said last part of my
Estate to dispose of as she may choose and that the parts left
to James & Robert Campbell & Miss Brown shall
not be sold by them or any Person for them unless the Ex-
piration of ten years but then said parts both as real and Personal
Estate shall be disposed of in the manner by the Executor
or Guardians as shall most conduce to the benefit of said James
& Robert Campbell & Miss Brown and my
Desire is that said Robert Campbell & Miss Robert Brown should
continue with my beloved Wife Eleanor Holliday the Term of the
ten years before mentioned and that he should be taught to read
write and cypher as far as the rules of three under the super-
intendence of my said Executors and the Expense thereof to be
discharged out of his part of my Estate and that said James & Robert
should also have an Education sufficient for the Transaction of ordinary
business or more if he inclines to it and that the Expense thereof
should be discharged out of his part of my Estate and I hereby
further provide that the parts of my Estate allotted to said James
& Robert Campbell & Miss Robert Brown particu-
larly so far as relates to real Estate should at the Expiration of
said ten years only be sold and no one both or either of them
should so sell or choose and I do hereby appoint my trusty
and well beloved Friend Philip M. Gray Executor of this my last

bed & calf, Walter Gresham has a Negro Boy named
Nelson at one hundred pounds a Horse Saddle and
Bridle Bed and furniture bed & calf, Emily Dearing
has had one hundred pounds in cash a Horse Saddle
and Bridle Bed and furniture bed & calf, Betsey Stearns
has had one Negro named Abner at one hundred
pounds a Horse Saddle and Bridle Bed and furniture
bed & calf my Will and Desire is that immediately

after my Death my Executors Deliver to my son Garland Gresham
Shaw a Negro Boy named Overton a Horse Saddle and Bridle Bed
and furniture bed & calf to make him Equal with what
the others before mentioned have received my Will and Desire
further is that my Executors as above Deliver to my son Dabney
Gresham a Negro Boy named Edward a Horse Saddle and
Bridle Bed and furniture bed & calf for the purpose last
mentioned and that said Executors as above Deliver to
my Daughter Susanne Gresham a Negro Girl named Mary a
Horse Saddle and Bridle Bed and furniture bed & calf and
pay to her at the General Division of my Estate two hundred
Dollars to make her Equal to those who are first mentioned
as having already received a part of my Estate and that my
Executors as above Deliver to my son Anderson Gresham
a Negro Girl named Maria a Horse Saddle and Bridle Bed
and furniture bed & calf and one hundred Dollars to be paid
at the general division of my Estate to make him Equal with
those who have already received a part of my Estate And
my Will and Desire further is that immediately after
the Decaying of my dear beloved Wife Emily Gresham the
balance of all my Estate both real and personal shall be Equally
Divided among all my Children To wit Thompson Gresham
