August One thousand eight hundred and Eighteen I John
Stanton of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky being
very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory
Thanks be to God thereof, and calling to mind the mortality
of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and
Testament In the way and manner Following To wit:
It is my Will that all my just Debts be paid or satisfied
secondly I Will and bequeath unto Melinda Stanton my dear
beloved Wife all of my Lands my Dapple Grey Horses my
stock of Cattle sheep and such of my stock of Hogs as
she may think proper to keep for her and my

Household and Kitchen furniture Farming Utensils
for her own proper use during her natural life or Widow-
hood and at her Death or Expiration of her Widowhood
I Will and bequeath my Lands to my dear beloved sons
Joseph Stalon Elijah Stalon and Gray Stalon when
they arrive at the age of twenty one year Here and at
the Death or Expiration of the Widowhood of Elizabeth Stalon
my Wife I Will and bequeath the remainder of my Property
except such as I Will to send to pay my Debts to my
beloved son Ezekiel Stalon and my daughter Elizabeth
Stalon Phoebe Williams Catharine Redman Mary Stalon
Polly Stalon Sally Stalon and Peggy Stalon to them their
Heirs and assigns for their own proper use forever
Here I Will that my Sister, Sarah Ann, Haggan and each
of my Stock of Hogs as Elizabeth Stalon my Wife shall not
think proper to keep for her own and Family's support
shall be sold at a Publick Sale the money and Profts
arising thereof to go to pay my just Debts and the remain-
der of the Money arising from the sale of there should
be any; I Will unto my Daughter Mary Stalon Polly
Stalon Sally Stalon and Peggy Stalon to them their
Heirs and assigns for their own proper use forever and
Lastly I do appoint my Trusty Friends Richard Rogard
and Reuben Franklin whom I constitute and ordain
my only and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testam-
ent and I do hereby utterly Disallow revoke and Annul
all and every other former Testament Wills Legacies and
Executors by me in any ways before this time named Wills
and bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day & year

buried by my surviving friends
Secondly I give to my Daughter Edith Legason Rachel Rice
Anne Cook and Martha Carter; and also my sons Ebenezer
Kelly James Kelly Samuel Kelly Jimmies Kelly and Robert Kelly
the sum of five Shillings each to them and their heirs forever
Thirdly I give to my beloved Wife Betty and to my three youngest
Children namely Jane Kelly Nancy Kelly and Judith Kelly all
my Estate both real and personal to w^{it} at the disposal
of my aforementioned Wife Betty in case she should not
marry again but if she should marry again it is my Will and
Desire the same should be sold at twelve months Credit
to my said Wife and my said Betty take her third of my
Estate both real and personal and the balance of my Estate
equally divided between my three youngest Children as named
above to them and their heirs forever
Fourthly I promise any of my youngest Daughters as is above named
should marry at Liverpool or Maryland the Deceased millage of
my Ap^{pt} it is my Will and Desire that said sum should pass
to my youngest Daughter forth coming to them be delivered to them
as they come of age or marry
Fifthly I promise my Marriages not marry it is my Will and Desire
it be sold at twelve months Credit
