I John Trotter of sound and disposing mind and memory but in a weak and declining State of Body do make ordain constitute and Appoint this to be my last Will and Testament In the first place I Commit my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust from whence it was taken to be buried in decent Christian like manner nothing troubling but I shall revive the same again at the General Resurrection My family whom I leave behind in this world I resign to the care and protection of that kind providence who superintends all human Affairs, recommending to them to make his laws contained in the holy scriptures their rule of life his Religion their support in trial and his Grace thro Christ the Foundation of their hope for Eternity.

With regard to my worldly property it is my Will that all my just Debts be paid so soon as arrangements can be made for that purpose; The Remainder thereof I give and Bequeath to my beloved Wife Chelia during her natural life or continued to be used and occupied after my Debts are paid in that way which she shall choose. If she should continue in trade let my Debts be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of the Stock of Goods now on hand. But should she again intermarry with any person it is my Will that my Executors hereinafter named should sell at public auction on a reasonable credit all my personal property; two thirds of the money so arising from such sale it is my Will I shall be equally divided between my Children, Pety Trotter Eliza Trotter and William Trotter; the remaining third I give to my Wife Chelia during her natural life the whole of this money it is my Will shall be put out upon Interest the Rent being sufficient

securing the interest to be divided agreeable to share to which each of the above legates are entitled.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Chelia Trotter and my friend James Kline Executors and Executors of this my Will; and I do publish and Declare this to be my last Will and Testament revoking all and every other Will or Wills which I may heretofore have made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty second day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Eleven.

 Kentucky being very sick & Weak in Body but of perfect
 mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling
 to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain
 this my last Will and Testament that is to say Principally
 and first of all I Give and Recommend my Soul into the
 hands of almighty God that give it and my Body I
 recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian
 burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting
 but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same
 again by the mighty Power of God and ascending such
 worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless this
 life I have devised and disposed of the same in the following
 manner and form

First I Give and bequeath unto Elizabeth my wife
 all my lands Stock of every kind and all my Farming
 Utensils and house hold Furniture During her widow
 hood The Whole being for the use of Raising my Children
 with their Mother & and as hereafter by herein to my

three oldest Children namely Esther & Nicholas and Corinna
 about to the amount of thirty Dollars each the one Daughter about
 and settled likewise wish each of the Boys to have a coat and saddle
 to be given to them at seventeen years of Age and the said to be
 one year old to the rest of my sons namely John & John
 and Samuel also they to have an equal portion with others
 as the now has or shall if Elizabeth my wife should die
 again they Land Stock Farming Utensils and house hold
 Furniture to be sold to at on years credit and divided among
 the whole following my Wife an equal part with the Children
 with holding the calculation of the three oldest Children the
 part they have got with it dividing the whole equally among
 all of them while each Child alike equal and if any of the
 rest of the Children should have received as herein is mentioned
 the life calculation to be made as with the three oldest
 Children or if my Wife Elizabeth should die during my widow
 hood the said calculation to be made as above stated
 shall constitute make Ordain my Beloved Wife Elizabeth
 and my son Nicholas my sole Executors of this my last Will
 and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and
 Disavow all and every other former Testament Will
 Legacies bequests and bequests by me in any way or before mentioned
 wills and bequests to be my last Will and Testament
 this and no other I'm Will respecting I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal Sixteenth day of November 1841
 Thomas Light hundred and twenty
