In the name of God Amen I John Wyall of the County of
Barren and State of Kentucky considering the uncertainty of this
mortal life and being of sound and perfect in mind
And Memory blessed be almighty god for the same, do make
And publish this my Last will and testament in manner
And form following Viz First I give and bequeath unto my daughter
in Law Martha Wyall one hundred acres of my Land situate
On the said Martha now lives, being the South Eastwardly end
of my Lands to hold to her the said Martha Wyall so
long as she remains a widow or during her natural life
If she remains a widow and at her death or marriage
to be equally divided between her four sons Jacob, John,
Radford Joseph and James all Wyall to be equally divided
Amongst them, their heirs or assigns forever at my decease
I do also give and bequeath unto my only sister Martha
Wyall single woman all the balance of Land with the
appurtenances thereto belonging, situate in the aforesaid
County and State, and on the waters of Blue Creek
to have and to hold this same peacefully and undisturbed
her natural life time, with the privilege to do with
as may seem best for her And at her death to be
Equally divided between my four grand sons Jacob John
Radford Joseph and James all Wyall or their heirs
forever, But be it remembered that my four grand
daughters Sarah Rebecca Sarah Mary and Martha Wyall
are to share equally in the profits on said Land during
their single life or whilst they remain unmarried, and after
as to all the residue and remains of my personal estate
Goods and chattles of what kind and nature soever
I give and bequeath unto my said sister Martha Wyall
after my death, with the privilege to dispose of as may seem
unto her at her decease I do hereby appoint both
Bradshaw and R.D. Shintberger Executors of this my Last will
and testament hereby revoking all former wills here made
