Underwood for collection and Paul Bonds Receipt for collection the balance on it being one hundred and twenty two fifty seven and the credits on said Receipt of Henry Bunnick and Mahlow Hale as involved together with Elizabeth Macey's Receipt not admitted were placed in the hands of Elijah Haydon administrator of the said Estate for the settlement of future debts and should be be not sufficient to the payment of said debts we have attested that the note of Hicks and of \$500 now in the hands of Joseph R.
