Barren and State of Kentucky being of Sound and Perfect mind and memory
Grubbs in thanks to almighty God for the same but knowing that it is
Mile appointed for all men once to die and the uncertainty of life and
not knowing when it may please God to call from time to eternity
Exam^d I do constitute make and Ordain this Instrument of Writing signed
with my own hand to be my last Will and Testament hereby Dispo-
sing of all my Worldly Goods in the following manner I do
Item I lend unto my beloved Wife Sarah Grubbs during her natural
life or Widowhood the Part of Land whereon I now live together
with all my Plantations Tools my Wagon and Gear and Stock of
Every kind together with my House hold and Kitchen Furniture (not
being otherwise disposed of) Also eight Negro Slaves, Leg. Pharaoh
May Pharaoh, Simon, Matilda, & Aaron and their future Increase
and at her Decase or future Marriage I give the said Part of Land
to my son Moody Grubbs and all the balance that may remain of
what is hereby lent unto my Wife to be Equally Divided between or
amongst all my Children or their Heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Susannah Corvill one
Negro Woman by the name of Ely with all her future increase also
one feather Bed and furniture which said Negro Woman and Bed are
now in her possession which said Negro Bed I give to her and her
Heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Anderson Grubbs and
his Heirs forever one Negro Boy by the name of Reuben Also one
Feather Bed and furniture which said Negro and Bed are now
in his possession - Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Mary Grubbs one Negro Woman named Hannah and her Child
Martha together with all their future increase also one feather
Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Frances Ford one Negro
girl named Amy with all her future Increase also one feather
Bed and furniture which said Negro girl and Bed are now
in her possession to her and her Heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Grubbs one Negro Boy
named Tom also one feather Bed and furniture which said Negro
boy and Bed are now in his possession to him and his Heirs
forever - Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah
Williams & her Heirs forever one Negro girl named Charlotte
with all her future increase also one feather Bed and furniture
which said Negro girl & Bed are in her possession
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Moody Grubbs and his Heirs
forever one Negro Boy named Ben also one feather Bed and furniture

42 I am which said Negro Boy and are now in his possession and also my tract of Land as mentioned in the first Item Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy Bush and her heirs forever one Negro Boy named Williams and one Negro Girl by the name of Nancy and her future increase also one Feather Bed and furniture which said Negroes and Bed are now in her possession My Will and Desire further is that if any of my Children above mentioned should die without lawful issue of their Body that in that case all such Legacy as is hereby given shall ^{be} divided again revert back to my Estate and be equally divided amongst those that survive or their Heirs Lastly I do hereby appoint my two sons Thomas Grubbs and Mary D K Grubbs and my friend Hardin Davis Executors of this my last Will and Testament And further my will and Desire is that my Estate shall not be appraised In Missouri whereof I have heretofore set my hand and seal this 15th day of July 1818
