James is to deliver Charlotte & her two children James Gillock is to deliver one negro Woman named Christian & her three children Edy and her child and Abner Wilson Guardian as aforesaid is to deliver Lydia and one child. The said Negroes are to be appraised & valued by the following Commissioners chosen & designated by the subscribing parties to wit, Samuel Murray and Thomas Ward Norton Lewis and James Wilson and if said Legatee cannot agree among themselves as to the Division of said Negroes after so valuations as before said the said Commissioners are to make Division & distribution of said property amongst the Legatee as aforesaid allotting to each an equal portion as the law directs.

And we and each of us hereby for the purpose of avoiding all litigation do hereby bind ourselves to be held and firmly bound to each to the other for the true & faithful performance of the conditions & stipulations in this Instrument in the penal sum of Ten Thousand Dollars in Testimony whereof We have here unto set our hands and affixed our seals this 21 day of Sept 1821

167 of Barron & having appraised the Negroes & children in families belonging to the Estate of said Robert Lee to the sum of Ten thousand four hundred & sixty two Dollars which said Negroes were in and premises divided by the Mutual Consent

In the Name of God Amen

I John Humphrey being sound in mind but infirm in body do hereby make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament

I Bequeath my Soul unto God who gave it and by Body to the earth from whence it came

Secondly I Bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret Humphrey all the property I have (after my just debts are paid which are but few and of small amount) during her life (except two cots) which I bequeath to my two Sons Robert Humphrey & Jackson Humphrey at the death of my wife it is my Will that all the property that she may then have be equally divided between my two Sons Robert Humphrey & Jackson Humphrey

I have given to my Children Sophia Belling, William Humphrey, Mary Cornett, James Humphrey & Susan Jackson their due proportion of my estate and therefore I give them nothing more.

I do hereby appoint my loving wife Margaret Humphrey Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Given under my hand & Seal this 8th day of March 1827
