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In the name of God Amen I Jonathan Sewell of the County of Warren and State of Kentucky, being weak in body but of a sound and perfect mind and memory, Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life I please as the Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, that is to say, after all my just debts are paid, out of my estate without interrupting any thing I shall bequeath unto my wife, First I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Sewell four hundred and ninety two dollars to dispose of as she pleases, I give her the same that came from her father's estate, Also I give her four negroes, Namely Sally, Martha, John and Sarah and their increase to dispose of as she may think proper, also one bed and sufficient furniture to one Bureau, one Cow and Calf and one saddle and bridle and all other articles she brought with her, all the above named money, negroes, all other articles, to belong to said Nancy Sewell forever, to dispose of as she pleases, I give and bequeath unto my son George D Sewell one half of the tract of land I now live on, the line is to run between where I now live and where my son George D Sewell now lives, so as to take half of the Spring in my pasture on the Bluff of the river, and four town lots in Chaptaintown, And be the said George D Sewell to be my sole executor, I bequeath unto my son Matthew Sewell the balance of the land where I now live and a stone quarry and eight or ten acres of land which I bought of Daniel Cook lying in or near the Narrows, and one rifle gun, Both of the above I bequeath to my sons as is above mentioned, And I bequeath unto the heirs of the body of Mary Stone, now dead, fifty acres of land the land Wm Stone now lives on, to them and their heirs forever, And likewise I wish for my son George D Sewell my executor to sell all my Negroes and other property, except what I left my wife and is not named in this my will, that I may leave at my death for him to sell and the money to be equally divided among all my children, except Nancy Roberts which I give fifty dollars more than the rest, and then an equal share with the rest namely George D Sewell, Jonathan Sewell, Sally Gray the heirs of the body of Mary Stone, Nancy Roberts, Margaret Nichols and heirs of the body of Elizabeth Seals dead, before any division is made of the money, I wish that my son George D Sewell have a stone wall round my grave and pay for the same out of the money of my estate, This being my last will and testament revoking all other former wills by me made, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal

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I Howard Nicholas, Novice of the County of Warren and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory and knowing that it is appointed for man once to die do make this instrument of writing my last will and testament revoking all former wills heretofore made, And after my decease with my funeral expenses paid as speedily as the nature of the case will admit of, My wish is that my wife Rosa Ann Hinder keep my cupboard and cupboards also my negro girl Mary Eliza and my boy mare call'd Mend also an equal share of my estate of my estate with my children not to include the above donations, I wish my executor hereinafter named to pay over \$100. to my three grown up negroes in equal portions that is Sillerman, Nancy and Jacob and that they be permitted to choose three masters who must pay the price set on them by Ole Young and Seth Boneste, My wish is that all my real and personal estate of what manner soever (except what I have given to my wife Rosa Ann Hinder) be sold in a credit of twelve months and the amount equally divided among my wife and children, I also nominate and appoint Anderson Wooten my executor to this my will In witness hereof I have set my hand and seal the 16th day of February 1847
