 Considering the uncertainty of Life and certainty of Death have
 thought proper to direct in what manner my Estate shall
 be disposed of After my Death and to prevent as much as
 possible a waste thereof and a contention among my
 representatives concerning the same I have made and do
 hereby make known my last Will and Testament as follows to wit:
 First it is my Will and Desire that my Executors herein named
 shall collect as soon as may be all Money due me and that
 they shall keep the same and all other my Real and personal
 Estate of Every kind and in every place whatsoever in their hands
 and control without any Sale thereof or any part thereof
 unless it becomes absolutely necessary for the payment of
 Expenses, or my just Debts or the maintenance of my Wife
 and Children until my son Thomas Hobbs Lepenberry
 shall arrive at the age of twenty one years of Age or my
 present Wife Susanna shall die terming whichsoever shall
 first happen making in the mean time the best profit of
 the same from the rent of my Real Estate the hire of my
 Slaves and the Interest of my Money.
 Secondly it is my Will and Desire that my Executors shall
 act as Guardians of my Children during their minority
 and that they shall out of the profits of my Estate if
 sufficient and if not out of my Estate maintain and edu-
 cate my Children in a decent manner and that they
 shall also maintain my Wife in a manner suitable to my
 Estate during the minority of my said son if she continue
 as long single and abiding by the provisions herein
 contained.
 Thirdly it is my Will and Desire upon the arrival of my
 said son to the age of twenty one years or of my Wife
 Intermarriage or upon his refusal to abide by the
 provisions contained in this my last Will and Testament
 and claiming her dower of my Estate according to Law
 which shall first happen that then and in either of the Cases
 aforesaid all and singular the residue of my Estate real and
 personal shall be divided between and amongst my
 four Children namely, Thomas Hobbs, Maria, Catharine
 Rebecca Glover, and Virginia Ann Lepenberry and my Wife

Susanna in the manner directed by the Laws of Kentucky for
 the distribution of Intestate Estates and for regulating the
 Course of descent in the same manner as if this my last Will
 and Testament had never been made and that my said Children
 and Wife have and hold the same Interest in their respective
 shares of my Estate as by the said Laws they would have and hold
 had I died Intestate.
 Lastly I Appoint my Brother Robert Lepenberry and William Leg-
 denberry Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby re-
 voking all Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore
 in any manner made.
