I Joseph Barry of Barren County and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of life and the Certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time it may happen do make Ordains Constitutes and declare, this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following To wit

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my son William Barry one Mare and one Cow Half ^{Barren} which he has already received from me.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Richard Barry one Mare and one Cow and Calf, and these he has previously received from me.

Item 3rd I give and Confirm unto the Wife of my son Joseph Barry the sum of ^{money} arising from a Mare and Cow and Calf which said Joseph Barry has some years past received from me

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann H. Barry one feather bed and furniture and one Cow and Calf, these she already received from me

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Moore one feather bed and furniture and one Cow and Calf, these she has received from me.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my son Wilson Barry one Mare and one Cow and Calf, and these she has already received from me.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Agnes Bramenton Alb Martin one feather bed and furniture and one Cow and Calf and this she has previously received from me.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Susannah W. Barry the Gray Mare & now own, one Cow and Calf and one feather bed with the following furniture To wit, two beds Quills, five Counterpane one Coverlet, and two sheets two Pillows and Cases.

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally T. Barry, a Chestnut Saddle Mare and Calf, and Saddle and one Cow and Calf, and one feather bed and furniture To wit, four Quills three Counterpane, one Coverlet, and two sheets and two Pillows and Cases.

Item 10th To my son John Barry, I give the tract of land containing two hundred acres whereon I now live, on condition that he when he becomes twenty one years of age shall pay to my two daughters Susannah W. and Sally T. Barry, twenty dollars each in the currency of Kentucky and suffering them during their single life to enjoy the privilege of living in the house I now live in as their home if they shall so choose, also a brown Mare and Saddle and a Cow and Calf also eighteen head of hogs, two beds and bedstead and furniture containing two

401 bed quilts and one Coverlet, one Counterpane and one sheet, and two Pillows and Cases

Also one Ax, plough bar and gear for one horse and one Logchain one to draw Cotton Wheel and one wedge Also six Barrows to furnish meat for them as a family, and to them as a family, I give all the Cotton Wool and fleece I now own, and three wheels, And the balance of my property not yet disposed of I desire may be sold and after paying my debts out of the proceeds therefrom arising the balance to be equally divided among my seven married children. And lastly I appoint my son Richard Barry and ^{my} son in law Edward Bramenton Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and departing all Wills legacies and testaments by me heretofore made for Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 22nd day of August 1825
