hundred dollars. to him his heirs & assigns forever

I have given to my Daughter Maria Louisa Button
one Horse Saddle and Bridle valued at
seventy five dollars, one Negro woman Carol and
her two children valued at eight hundred dollars
and one boy Ben valued at six hundred dollars
also one Girl Clara valued at four hundred dollars
to her her heirs & assigns forever

I give to my grand Son Octavius Whitney one Negro
woman Betty and her two children valued at
eight hundred dollars I give to him also two other
boys Charles and Sam the two valued at twelve
hundred dollars

Further more I give to my Grand Son
Octavius Whitney one Girl Charlot valued at five
hundred dollars all this I give him I should he
live and arrive to the age of twenty one years and
provided that Octavius should not live to arrive
to the age of twenty one years. The same which
I have given to him, to be equally divided among
my several children herein before mentioned or

It is in addition to what I have given to my
Daughter Elizabeth Mules. I give to her also
one Negro boy Frank valued at five hundred

dollars. Making in all \$2755 to her her heirs and assigns
forever

In addition to what I have given to my Daughter Sara-
h. M. Bush, I give to her also one Negro girl Lucy
valued at three hundred dollars to her heirs and as-
signs forever Making in all

In addition to what I have given to my Daughter Virginia
Muby. I give to her also a Negro boy Susan valued at three
hundred dollars. to her her heirs and assigns forever making
in all

When the portion of land which I have given before
mentioned, to my Son Boamges & Martin Button to wit
one hundred and fifty acres to each of them has been
laid off or surveyed

the remaining portion I supposed to be near four hundred
and acres and valued at twenty two hundred and
sixty dollar and it being the portion of land whereon
I now live and the same I give to my two children
Thomas M. Button and Maria Louisa Button jointly
as follows- Being indebted to my son Thomas M.
Button to the amount of nine hundred dollars to be paid
in the fore mentioned tract of land, and in addition
to what I have given to him I also give to him
seven hundred and sixty dollars interest in the
said land and the five hundred paid in said
making his joint interest or entire interest twelve hundred
and sixty dollar and Maria Louisa Button interest
in said land valued at one thousand dollars I give
to them jointly in the fore named proportions to them
their heirs & assigns forever. I have given it them
as follows hundred and sixt more or less
