attention and disposing memory, but calling to mind the uncertainty of life
and the inevitable certainty of death, do make, declare, and publish this as
my last Will & Testament, hereby Canceling, disannulling and disallowing
all other and former Wills and Testaments or bequests whatsoever.
And first of all I commend my soul and spirit into the
hands of God who gave them to be received and disposed of as I may, for his
son the Redeemer takes my body when dead to be buried in such style as
may suit the taste of my children and Executors.
As to the little with which Heaven hath been pleased to bless me, I expect the
dispositions herein after to be mentioned to implore regarded, and observed.
I wish my Executors herein after to be named, to sell so much of my purchase
property, as can be well spared, without detriment to the family to defray
the funeral expenses and pay all my just debts and to sell the following

all Negroes if a fair price can be had namely Bassari, Benjamin Clark and Jack
and with some of the avails thereof as may be necessary to build and fit up in a decent
manner, a dwelling house and other needful buildings of Brick or Sumptions suitable for
the accommodation of my surviving family, and the balance, if any, to be put in interest in
safe hands And where as I have two families of children namely, Robert the elder, Fanny,
and William M. Hall, the children of my first dear and much lamented Wife; and my 2^d the daughter
of Robert Stockton deceased, and John B. James P. Mary J. and Joseph M. Hall, the children of my
second present and much loved Wife Susanna M. the daughter of John Alexander, I therefore
intend to be no respecter of Persons, but that all my said Children, shall be equal heirs in
my estate the old the young the male the female, that no preference or deference shall be made
except what may arise from the inequality of their Mothers portions: As the Children of my
first Wife are to have whatever Legacy have been or may hereafter be acquired from the
Estate of her Father Robert, Stockton and the Children of my second Wife to have what Legacy
may have been or may hereafter be acquired from the estate of her father John Alexander
and that all my said Children of both families have equally divided amongst them whatever
Legacy may have been, or may hereafter be acquired from the estate of my deceased Father John
Hall with all the unconsumed earnings of my life under such regulations limitations and
exceptions as shall hereafter be mentioned — I have endeavored to give to my eldest children
a common English Education, it is my wish that my younger children shall receive each
at least, a similar education. Whatever Legacy may come to the heirs of my Executors, for
my daughter Charinda and Fanny, and my son William Smith my daughters to receive
therein when they need it or at all events, when married, and William to be put to interest, and the
interest to be regularly or occasionally (as it may be sufficiently employed in his education, until
he shall be of age) — after my sons John, James, and Joseph and my daughter Mary shall have
received from the undivided funds of my estate such an Education as Robert, Charinda
and Fanny have received should my Executors have received any additional Legacy from
the Estate of the said John Alexander, besides the said Legacy if in money, to be made to
produce interest and the interest to be employed in the further Education of my children
John James Mary & Joseph. Provision has already been made for my son Robert and
my daughter Charinda and Fanny, as to the Horse saddle and cattle wearing clothes
bed and furniture, for each the horses were young and lively, and the other articles new
and of good quality, when given. It is my wish that each of my other children shall be
furnished in like manner, when necessary.
I have received from the Estate of Robert Stockton deceased six hundred and twenty five
dollars, in property value at special one hundred and five dollars in specie and twenty
dollars in commonwealth paper, making in all eight hundred dollars, the money
subject to the call of my first set of children, or their agents, the value of the property to
be paid over to them after the death of my present Wife. It is my wish that my much
loved Wife Susanna shall retain and enjoy peaceable possession of the farms on which
I now reside, the stock, tools & furniture of every description except some of which
as may be necessary to give to the children or sell, and as many of my negroes as
may be alive and unsold during her life, should she remain single, but
if she should marry, or die, by the by to which I feel no sort of objections then
and in that case it is to be at her Option to take a child's part absolute or li-

413 as her thirds for life, with the Exception that in either Case she is to retain possession, of all the farm on which I now live during her natural life. Upon the death of my said Wife it is my Will that the following disposition and distribution of my unassuming Estate shall be made namely, that the farm on which I live, my other lands, and a lot in the Town of Glasgow, and all my personal and perishable property not herein otherwise disposed together with the following Negroes or each of them as have not been previously sold, namely Caesar, Benjamin, Mark and Jude, at such Estate and for such Purposes, as my Executors may be of Opinion will best promote the interest of my children, and from the money arising therefrom pay over equally to my first family of children six hundred and twenty five dollars the value of property purchased, at the sale of Robert Mackland Dec^d and the money if any received from the said Estate and the price of my slave Mark, who came from that Estate, — And to my second family of children equally the price of Jude, who came from the Estate of John Mackland and the unassuming funds, which I consider except the boys Talbot and Stephen who are from the Mackland Estate, exclusively my own, to be equally divided amongst all my said children, including both families with the exceptions herein after mentioned. — I wish my Executors to procure three disinterested intelligent men to value the residue of my Negroes, namely Franky, Talbot, Stephen and Annan and such children as Franky or Jude may hereafter have and that they be divided at valuation Clarinda taking a share of Fanny, Franky, John Talbot, and James Stephen. Should Jude have another child my daughter Mary to have that, if two my son Joseph to have one, if more than two John, James, Mary and Joseph to draw for choice, should Franky bring other children my son Robert to have the first and William the next if more than two then Robert, William, Clarinda and Fanny and to draw for choice; after this dividing the Negroes, the money is to be so divided as to make each family equal that is to say to make Robert, Clarinda, Fanny and William equal, with each other and John, James, Mary and Joseph equal with each other, and should there then be any difference between my two families of children it must be done owing to a difference of their mothers fortune as I intend all to have equal in mine, and each family equal in their Mother's — I do hereby give and bequeath sundry articles for which the names to whom given are not to be changed, namely to my Wife Susanna, my riding horse, Pier; to my son Robert, my silver bodied Walking cane, and Garter case; to my daughter Clarinda, Fanny and Mary, each one gold ring set with my own hair taken from my head after death, to my son William my case of Sarcnets, to my son John my pocket knife, Spaying needles and horse Phogons, to my son James my money's case, and to my son Joseph my law Books, and map of Kentucky, And to that son which my Executors may judge the most Compliant with them, my sundry instruments and some articles not claimed by any children here. I wish them to have without charge such as Robert and Felly, Clarinda, Wager P. And finally it is especially my Will that my family should be happy in this life and that which is to come.
