I now it is also my will and desire, that Jane Elizabeth Lewis, shall have the property left to her at the death of my wife or her own disposal and at her death to be equally divided amongst her children - and it is my will and desire, that William Lewis husband to the said Jane Elizabeth Lewis, shall have no power to take, sell or by any means consume the property left by this my last will and testament, to his wife Jane Elizabeth Lewis, I now I also bequeath to Joseph Crockett Woodson an execution which lies in the office of Barron Circuit Court against Tucker Moore Woodson with interest and all benefits arising from such execution

It is reported and stated to me, that Tucker Moore Woodson has a piece of writing purporting to be one third of my property at my death. If any such paper exists I do protest against it as I never executed such a piece of writing and the writing he held is a forgery

Lastly I constitute and appoint my dear beloved friends, Henry Bratcher and Col Samuel Edwards Executors of this my last will and testament

Here the words (and more) uttered between Bonaparte which, in my first item, also the alteration in the name of my grandson Robert Llewellyn Woodson at the latter end of my second item - were all inserted by my desire before I set my hand and seal to this my last will and testament

In Witness of all and each of the things here in contained I have set my hand and seal, this ~~eleventh~~ day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen

I John Bybee of the County of Barron and State of Kentucky being of sound mind memory and understanding the weak in Body and in very low State of health and knowing that it is appointed for me to die and the time thereof uncertain do constitute appoint & ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in form and manner following First it is my Will and Desire that after my Death the Plantation whereon I now live shall be divided as near the middle as possible by a line passing Glover's Creek and that my beloved Wife Betsey Bybee do & shall keep the part including my Dwelling House and other Improvements thereunto belonging together with all & singular the Kitchen and Household Furniture and the Stock of
