among my orphan children the heirs of her body, namely Elizabeth Mansfield William Mansfield Henry Mansfield Rachel Mansfield Mary Mansfield John Mansfield John Mansfield Nancy Mansfield and Isaac Mansfield, these in the children of my wife Mary Mansfield, this I have done for the love I have for her and my dear children as I am this day in my full mind and senses. County & State of Kentucky being aged & infirm in body

be paid out of the proceeds of my personal estate or
money due or owing to me and when it shall be collected
which I desire to be done as soon as convenient after
my decease, and that whatever money when collected
and all of my personal estate that I possess at my
decease including a clock now in possession of Samuel
Lewels be held by and appropriated to the use benefit
& support of my beloved wife Mary Jameson and my
grandson Achilles J. Gatewood during the life of my
said wife Mary Jameson - Secondly it is my will
and desire that after my decease my grandson
Achilles J. Gatewood shall have two hundred acres of
land a part of Marshall's upper survey of the Blue

Spring Grove tract land off for him adjoining Jacob Mag-
gards survey. and the lines to run at right angles with
the east line of the original survey so as to be in convenient
form also the following slaves to wit Aggy & her children
namely Charity Parkins Hepkins Jacob Markish Innes
& Seneca and their increase, hereby giving & bequeathing to
my said grandson Achilles J. Gatewood an absolute to
the aforesaid land & slaves reserving any benefit and
apportioned that may be necessary and the use of any of
said slaves to my beloved wife Mary Jameson during
her life - Thirdly It is my will & desire that after my
decease my beloved wife Mary Jameson shall have a
sufficient maintenance & support out of my estate
after my death so long as she may live and after decease
my grandson Achilles J. Gatewood shall be entitled to the
whole of what may remain of my estate after the decease
of my beloved wife Mary Jameson - Lastly I do hereby
appoint my friend William Logan & James
B. Jameson my executors of this my last will & testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this 20th day of December 1838.
