furniture belonging thereto my trunk brose cut, saw,
and log chain and cap and to him during his
natural life and all his heirs that he has by his lawful
be. Now children that he has by his first wife Sarah.
Now I will and bequeath unto my dear beloved
Daughter Elizabeth Myatt my coat

of coin to leave my stock of cattle hogs sheep and cotton patch
to her and her heirs forever. I leave I will and leguall unto my
dear beloved Daughter Abigail & Franklin and all
more Wholly the manner of this my by little my holding
half table and looking Glass to her and her heirs forever.
I leave I will and leguall unto my dear beloved Son Robert
Cannon and feather bed Bedstead and furniture belonging
there to by little and collar during his natural life and if
in decess the feather bed and furniture to be given unto his
son Paulson I leave I will and leguall unto my dear beloved
Daughter Judith Pratt's one set tea kettle and coffee
Milk to her and her heirs forever. I leave I will and leguall unto
my Dear beloved Daughter Sally minner one dollar silver
and her hair pin and the balance of my property consisting
of a Shawl one table and one two winged bed and two hogs
one pair of silvers and needles and seven two pair of
shoes two hand saws three chairs and one shovel plough
to be sold on a twelve month credit and the money to be
given to my other three children namely my Daughter Francis
Brookman my son Reuben Harrison and my Daughter
Sally Gale to them and their heirs forever and last I do
appoint my truly friends Samuel & Thomas and Henry
Wright to whom I subscribe and ordain my only and
sole executor of this my last will and testament and do
hereby utterly dissolve revoke and annul all and every
other former testament. Will Ology and co executor by me
in any way before this time made written and leguall
Willing and confirming this are no other to be my last
will and testament and it is my will that the property
that is to be sold named in this will and the money given
to three Executors Francis Brookman Reuben Harrison
and Sally Gale that the executors may sell without apprehension
or an order for sale from Court. In Witness whereof I
