my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make and declare this my last
Will and Testament that is to say principally and

first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the
hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend
to his earth to be buried in decent Christian manner at
the discretion of my executors then it is my Will that my
son John Bap & Talbot Bap shall have the tract of land that
I now live on divided equally between them agreeable to
quantity and quality then it is my Will that my son John
Bap shall have certain by share then I will that my
son Talbot Bap have the first fourth of the above mention-
ed by share & also it is my Will that my son Talbot have
a certain fixed cow & calf and increase then I will that
my Daughter Polly have one feather bed then it is my
Will that my Daughters wife Polly have certain by share
house now in my possession then it is my Will that the
remainder of my property be equally divided amongst the
following Children I will Elizabeth & Polly John Nathaniel
Talbot & William then it is my Will that the following
Children be it Sally Peter & Mary Nathaniel Warren & Isaac
be considered & provided with what I have given them, then it is
my Will that the whole of my Estate remain in the hands of
my beloved wife Polly her life time except the above mentioned
by share to my son John to be put in possession of when he
comes of age the certain fixed cow & calf & increase to my
son Talbot when he comes of age

Last of all I do appoint & constitute my beloved wife
Polly Cochrane & under her will executor of this my
