make and ordain this my last Will and Testament It is my will  
and desire that my last will should first be paid out of the moneys due  
me or out of my personal property and after the discharging of my last debts  
It is my will and desire that my wife should have the balance  
of my Estate during her natural life or widowhood and should my  
wife think proper at any time she may sell the land share or one  
share of her purchasing of one hundred acres of Land equal value  
where she may think proper and at the close of my wife's life or widow-  
hood It is my will and desire that the lands that my wife should  
own should be equally divided between my two sons Isaac Hill  
and John Hill These It is my will and desire that at the close of my  
wife's life or widowhood that my son Isaac Hill should have up to  
one half of the land and one half of the balance of my stock of horses  
and one half of the plantation and also It is my will and desire  
that at the close of my wife's life or widowhood that my son John Hill  
should have one half of the land and one half of the balance of my  
stock of horses and one half of the plantation and also It is my will  
and desire that if my wife should think proper that she may sell as many as three of the Negroes out of  
my stock of Negroes that it is not specifically given and the proceeds  
of the sale of said land and stock and one half of the plantation to be equal-  
ly divided between my two sons Isaac Hill and John Hill It is my will  
and desire that if my two children that in the State of Mississippi at this  
time should alive and live by a covenant to my wife until her death  
or so many as may return and live to live shall have their equal  
share of all of my property that may not be specifically given and  
the two and all of them that do not return and live by my wife's life  
death or marriage there shall be so much of my property sold over and  
above what will take to pay my last debts as will give to each one  
five dollars that do not return and comply with the conditions here-  
in mentioned It is my will and desire that if my children John Hill Isaac  
Hill James Hill Margaret Hill and I were as well as John Hill  
do not return and comply with the conditions of this will that in the  
division of my property not particularly named I should my children  
still living live into those that may return from the Mississippi  
and comply with the within conditions that should the Negroes given  
my son Isaac Hill and John Hill these not be worth as much as the

Rebecca In the name of God Amen I Rebecca Coe of the  
Co. County of Warren and State of Kentucky Being sick  
and weak in body but of sound and perfect mind.  
will Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty  
of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly  
affairs and thereby be the better prepared to face the world  
when it shall please God to call me hence do therefore  
make and publish this my last will and Testament  
in manner and form following (That is to say)  
First and principally I Commit my soul to God and  
my body to the earth to be decently buried at the  
discretion of my Executor hereinafter named and after  
my debts and funeral charges are paid I bequeath and  
bequeath as follow -

First my will is that after my Debts and Funeral
