The Commonwealth of Kentucky To the Sheriff of Richardson & my Constable of Barren County Greeting whereas Information hath this day been made to us Thomas Minion Warrant and Thomas Dickenson two of the acting Justices of the Peace for said County by James Young and George Young former of said County that they did this day the 2nd of March 1812 on the main Road leading from Thomas Elphinstone of said County to the Court House where of find on

said Road about one mile from the Creek called the Caring fork of Peters Creek near a Stake Hollow and partly up the Hill of said Hollow & Dead Body of a white Man whom they afterwards found out to be certain Ball Richardson who lived & resided at or in the Town of Glasgow and County of said and was by Trade a Black Smith and appeared to have Died there They found him by some accident unknown to them as it was some distance from the place where he was found and it appearing to us the J. Minion and Dickenson that Barren County is destitute of a Coroner and that an Inquest is necessary to be held over the said Dead you are therefore and by the Authority of the Commonwealth aforesaid Required forth with and without Delay to summon with you Respectable Housekeepers to meet immediately at the House of Samuel Roundtree and there to convene upon their Oaths to State if with in their powers or knowledge by what proper manner or means the aforesaid Ball Richardson did Die or was killed if by Murder to say so &c. and you are hereby Commanded to take into your Charge bare all and every Article of property that may be found with the De. and this shall be your Warrant for doing Given under our hands and Seals this 29th of March 1812
