make constitute and declare this my last Will and Testament
principally and first of all I recommend my soul to God and
my body to be committed to the earth according to the custom of the
Country & I desire all my just Debts to be paid
Then the balance of my property I dispose of in the following
manner as follows (viz) I give unto my Sister Elizabeth
Francis five Shillings Sterne I give my Brother James Glas-
brook five Shillings I give I give twenty Dollars to the stretched
Court where I die that is the County & to be put to interest and
the Receiver where the Court is to draw the interest thereof
Annually I then the balance of my Estate I give and bequeath
to my three Brothers and Sisters viz John Glasbrook Richard
Glasbrook & Polly Glasbrook to them & their Heirs forever
to be equally divided amongst them lastly I appoint my brother
William Glasbrook and my friend John King my Executors of this
my last Will and Testament ratifying & confirming this and no
other to be my last Will and Testament revoking and making
null and void all other Wills and Wills heretofore made by
me and consider this my last Will and Testament as written by
hand and seal this day of March eighteen hundred & sixteen

County and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of perfect
mind and memory do hereby be given to God, calling unto mind the over-
tality of my life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is
to say as touching such worldly estate which unto it has pleased
God to bestow on me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form
First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Gentry my
good bed and furniture and her wardrobe to dispose of them
at her death as she thinks proper. Also I give to my
well beloved wife Sarah Gentry all my Estate real and personal
during her life time or widowhood except such property as
I shall hereinafter bequeath; Also I give and bequeath unto my
son or the survivor one good horse to wit fifteen dollars for
the use of sitting of him a saddle. Also I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Elizabeth Gentry one good bed and furniture
to wit one good bedstead with cover and as for my negro woman
Jude she is to serve my wife Sarah Gentry during her widow-
hood and at the end of her widowhood the said negro woman Jude
shall be free so far as this that she shall go to live with any
one of my children that she please to live with and if she
wishes to and with my desire is that my son or daughter
that she lives with shall maintain her during her life time
and as for my negro boy Rich he is to serve my wife Sarah until
next new year's day and then after that he is to be hired for twelve
months from next new year's day and after that time to be free and
the directors is to be to his freedom according to law and
his hire is to be equally divided among all my children and
if there should be any of my father's estate coming to me from
North Carolina I want it to be equally divided among all
my children and all the estate land and personal left to my
wife during her widowhood when she dies it at her death
is to be sold and equally divided among all my children
except my negro woman Jude and I do hereby utterly disclaim
revokes and annuls all and every other former Testament wills
devises bequeaths and donations by me here named made
and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last Will and Testament. Also I constitute John
Clappett and Benjamin Coleman my sole Executors of this my
last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and foot this 26th day of Feb.
