In the name of God Amen I Richard Hoggson
Senior of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky being
old and full of age but of sound mind and memory thanks
to God for the same do make and obtain this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills & Testaments
made by me First I commend my soul to God who gave it not
deserving but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
from the hands of the same benevolent Giver and my body to
the dust from whence it was taken to be buried in a decent
Christian life manner at the discretion of my Executors and as
to what worldly goods and effects as it has been pleased a kind
providence to bestow on me I will and dispose of in the following
manner First I leave unto my beloved wife Mary Hoggson
for and during her Widowhood all my Estate both real and personal
and after her death or death I do dispose of it in the
following manner
After the marriage or death of my said wife I will and bequeath
that all my Estate be equally divided between all

my children and the grand children of such of my children as may now be dead or such as shall be dead when either ~~one~~ of the above events shall take place shall be made to an equal distribution in the same manner as their parents should have been in title had they lived that is to say all the children of one of such deceased child shall be entitled to one share subject however to this exception that such of my children as have had any portion whatever from me or shall have from me hereafter before my death shall account for the same and such sum or portion shall be considered as a part of their proportions of any to be to be being my intention that each shall have an equal part of my estate including what they have got or may hereafter get before my death.

But it is my Will and desire notwithstanding the above gift I desire that my grand children heirs of my late son James Wagoner shall not claim held possess or enjoy any part of what I have given to them by this Will until all of them shall have made to Beverly Bradley or to his heirs or assigns a general Warranty Deed for the land which he lives on and which I purchased and paid their father for and further it is my Will and desire notwithstanding the gift and bequest above said that the land which I now live on containing two hundred acres shall be held in trust by my son in Law Beverly Bradley for the purpose of paying to him a general Warranty Deed to one hundred and six acres which I ~~sold~~ to him & which I purchased of my said son James Wagoner which said two hundred acres is not to be sold or sold to make a dividend until the said heirs of my said son James shall have made a deed as aforesaid to the said Beverly Bradley for the land aforesaid to be given to him. Provided also that my said grand children heirs to my said son James shall not be entitled to any benefit from this my Will until they shall all have made a deed in fee simple to all the heirs of my estate to the remainder of the said tract of land which I purchased of their father which is ninety four acres.

Lastly I constitute nominate and appoint my son Thomas Wagoner and my friend Thompson Crosshaw Executors to this my last Will and Testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 20th day of December in the year of our Lord 1846 Richard Wagoner Esq.
