 mind and memory do make and Ordain this to be my last Will
 & Testament in the Words and manner following. To wit.

I Will devise and bequeath to my son Saml Douglas my negro
 girl names Fanny to him and his Heirs forever.

I Will devise and bequeath to my son Williams Douglas the
 sum of four hundred dollars to be deducted out of the money he
 shall owe me to him and his Heirs forever.

I Will devise and bequeath to my Daughter Sally three one
 dollar in Cash to her and her Heirs forever.

My Will I do desire also is that my Negro Girl Emily and
 my riding horse be sold and all my just debts collected and the
 money arising from the same to be equally divided between six
 Legacies namely Mary Will, Nancy Lacey, Selig Bagby, Nathan
 Douglas, William Douglas, & Saml Douglas to them and their
 Heirs forever and also with same Equality between the Heirs of my
 son John Douglas Dec^d and the Heirs of my daughter Milly Swanson
 Dec^d that is to say the Heirs of my son John Douglas Dec^d all jointly
 to have one equal share with each of the before mentioned six Legacies
 and that one equal share to be equally divided among the said
 Heirs of John Douglas Dec^d and the Heirs of my daughter Milly Swanson
 Dec^d to have an equal share with the Heirs of John Douglas Dec^d to
 them and their Heirs forever. I do hereby nominate constitute and
 appoint Henry F Greenwood my Executor to this my last Will & Testament
