 ed amongst the Legacies and when divided by nine the number
 of Legacies gives \$799.49 the sum to which each Legacy is entitled
 The following allotments of property were then made with a view
 to equalize the Legacies namely To Sarah Foster in Cash lately advan-
 ced \$200 Biddy a Negro Girl at \$125 and her part of the woman
 loaned to her makes \$274.77 which makes \$834.02 and is \$34.13
 over her share To Parchal Foster the woman lately at \$300 boy
 Richmond at \$175 and Girl Peggy at \$75 and \$27.77 for his
 part of the Girl Amy loaned to his mother which several sums
 when added to the advance made him by his Father amounts
 \$801.83 and is \$2.74 over his share To Henry Foster the woman
 Phoebe at \$250 and Girl Caliga at \$175 which when added to
 the advance made him by his Father with addition of his part
 of the Girl Amy loaned to his mother amounts to \$826.32
 and is \$27.302 over his share To James Carver and wife the
 Boy Samuel at \$100 and \$27.77 their part of the Girl Amy
 loaned to their mother which when added to the advance
 made by the old gentleman amounts to \$801.832 and
 is \$2.80 over their share To Thomas Duncan & wife the Girl
 Clarissa at \$137.50 and \$27.77 for their part of the Girl Amy
 loaned to their mother which sums when added to the advan-
 ce made by the old gentleman amounts to \$718.77
