In the name of God Amen I Ruben Harrison son of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky, being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament. Imprimis I give and bequeath my soul to God that gives it, me, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of my Executors, hereafter to be named; and as touching of such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of the same, in the following manner, and form. Item, It is my Will and desire, that all my just debts, should be paid. Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Elizabeth, one black mare known by the name of Harris, one saddle and bridle, two feather beds and furniture one Cow and Calf, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Carbone, one Negro girl, named Breaner, and her increase, one horse known by the name of Jerich one feather bed and furniture, one Cow and Calf, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Francis White, one Negro girl named Sophia and her increase one bed and furniture, one Cow and Calf, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my son Robert, one boy horse, one saddle and bridle one bed and furniture one Negro Mare, named Peg, to him and his heirs forever. Item I give my son Ruben, one negro boy named Emanuel, one barrel horse, named Joe, one saddle one bridle one bed and furniture, to him his heirs forever. Item I give my daughter, Polly, one Negro girl named Abby, and her increase one gray horse one saddle and bridle one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. Item, I give to my daughter Mary one Negro boy named Jackson, one bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Judith one Negro girl, named Sophia one boy mare one saddle and bridle one bed and furniture, one Cow and calf to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my son Samuel Franklin, one Negro slave named Simon, one gray horse one saddle, one bed and furniture, to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my dear beloved Wife, one Negro slave named Jack another Negro slave, named King, one Negro Mare named Huger my stock of horses, cattle, Hogs, sheep, house hold, and Kitchen furniture, forming utensils my Wagon

and Green, and my Crop of Corn, Tobacco, Wheat, and Oats, during her natural life and at her death to be disposed of as she thinks most proper.

Lastly I do constitute & appoint my son Samuel & Harrison, and my grand son William & Franklin as my Executors, and my wife Peggy Harrison as my Countess of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and disannulling all all former Wills, & Testaments by me made, by Testimony whereof I have hereunto, set my hand and affixed my seal this tenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, signed sealed and acknowledged by the Testator to be his last Will & Testament in the presence of us

In the name of God Amen
I Robert Stockton of Barren County State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory and viewing the shortness and uncertainty of my mortal life. And being desirous to make a distribution of my estate among my family according to my own mind do make and Ordain this my last will and testament. Item, To my eldest son Robert Stockton who is now dead I had given him in his lifetime money to purchase a Negro man and I gave him a Negro girl and half of a 1000 acres of land I purchased of Robert Menins and made him a title to it besides sundry other things which I took upon to be as much as he is entitled to of my estate and therefore I make no further provisions for him or his heirs. To my son Ruben Stockton I have given one Negro boy named Jo a horse and saddle & about seven hundred dollars to discharge his debt at Philadelphia after I have furnished what intances to be applied to the expenses of his education I also gave him half of a 1000 acre tract of land I purchased of Robt Menins and made him a title to it, and other small things which I think is his full share of my estate I therefore make no further provision for him. To my two youngest sons James B. Stockton & Joseph B. Stockton I give and bequeath all that part of the tract of land on which I now live, which lies in the south side of little Barren river to be divided between them by Beginning at the mouth of the first branch that runs into little Barren River below the mouth of Clay like fork on the south side of the river, then running

292 up the branch with its meanders, to a place marked as a Corner thence a straight line to a well thereupon on the left hand side of the road leading from my house to James B. Blackstone's which is marked as a Corner thence a straight course to a small East Lake, marked - on the South side of the Survey and my Will is that Joseph B. Blackstone have my dwelling house and that part of said land lying on the West side of said dividing line, and that James B. Blackstone have that part of said land lying on the East side of said line. Beginning at the mouth of the branch where said dividing line begins running thence up the river on the south side to Reed's line thence with Reed's line to Farishes and with the widow Rogers, ^{Coopers} ~~Farishes~~ ^{Farishes} thence with the dividing line of one said to my son James B. Blackstone's land and beginning, a Negro boy Andy, a Negro girl named Rachell, their child named Emerson and the stock which I have given him, and which he has in possession.

I gave to Joseph Blacklow my negro girl Dinah Negro boy Anthony.
 & my daughter Paul & 1/2

To my daughter Rachel Howard, who is now dead I had given to her and her husband ^{who was her} three ^{or} ^{four} tracts of land in Virginia which I purchased of Robert Berry and £179-6d in part of price of a mill I let them have, I also gave them a Negro man named Anthony Handy articles of stock household furniture which I think her full part I therefore make no further provision for her or her heirs To my daughter Nancy Robertson I have given, when she was first married £100 in cash and a Mulatto Girl, named Sunday I have since given her a Negro woman named Jerry & Martha her child, which will that she keep, to the use of her and her heirs, which I think her proportion of the negroes.

To my daughter Sally Thompson, who is dec. I give in her lifetime a negro man named Peter, house-hold furniture, and stock, when she first married and since I gave her her husband, one hundred pounds in cash and a tract of land in virginia which her husband sold, to Brillmann and two hundred pounds out of the price of a Mill tract of land sold her husband in Kentucky all of which she Wm Thompson her husband has had in advance which I think is the full share of my said daughter Sally, I therefore make no further provision for her or her heirs,

To my daughter Dickey Garnett, I have given when she first married a Negro woman named Betty and her two youngest children, Minny & Edy and a Mare and a Cow, & half blood which I will that she keep, & give to her as before to my daughter Fanny Ball who I gave in her lifetime a young negre woman named, Mary and a boy named black, a Mare & Cow which will her heirs shall have and enjoy forever

As to my daughter Unity ^{she} I had given her Considerable property which she has unfortunately lost, by mismanagement, and from the peculiar situation in which now is I think it not prudent to give her any more property, but for her support and maintenance I give to James P. Blacklock & Joseph B. Blacklock, my boy & boy Patrick instant to keep during the life of my said daughter Unity and that they for the use of said boy, support in a decent manner their said sister Unity & should my said daughter die before said Boy Patrick the said Boy is to be returned to my estate and Equally divided, among those of my children, which

399 have not had an equal part of my estate ^{according} to my judgment and in case Patrick should die, before Unity my will is that, all my children that have a claim, in the late and other property of my estate that is yet undivided shall bear an equal part in supporting her during her life, to my daughter Catharine Bishop I have given when she was married a Negro boy named Gatewood and a Negro Girl named Amy & a horse and some Cattle and bed Room other household furniture, which I will that she keep and enjoy. To my daughter Prudence, Hall I have given a Negro boy named Owen, and a Negro Girl named Mourning, a horse a bed room Cattle & household furniture, which I wish her to have and enjoy.

In Case my son Joseph B Stockton should die without lawful issue, my Will is
 that James P Stockton in lieu of the Land herein before bequeathed to him have
 all that part of the tract of Land on which I live that lies West of the clay lick fork
 & south of Little Barren River, and in Case the said James P Stockton should
 die without ^{lawful} issue and Joseph B Stockton should survive him, he shall have said
 last mentioned boundary of land in lieu of that herein before provided for him
 and in Case, of the death of either of my said sons, James P or Joseph B. without
 issue as aforesaid, it is my Will and I do hereby provide that the Land and Negroes
 and other personal property, which is hereby bequeathed, to such decedent, and
 its increase, shall revert to my estate, and be subject to the same kind of division
 herein after provided for the Balance of my property, and among the same dischur-
 -tes — My Will is that my Negro Man Dick & his Wife be free, at my death
 that they have from my estate 5 Barrels of Corn, a plow-horse a Cow Half 300 weight
 of Pork, a bushel of salt an She a hoe & plow.

"To my beloved wife Catharine Jackson I give and bequeath my negro child Eliza to do with and dispose of as she pleases, and I further wish that my Wife have all my negroes not herein otherwise disposed of and all my stock of horses Cattle sheep hogs & fowls, and all the household and Kitchen furniture & farming tools and Hogg, and all the stock of Provisions that may be on hand at my death, and that my Wife keep possession of my dwelling house, & plantation and all that appertains to it, during her natural life, and that my Wife be at liberty, to sell any of the personal Estate, except Negroes, for the payment of debts, or for obtaining necessary provisions, to live on, and at the death of my Wife, it is my Will that all the Negroes (except Eliza who my Wife is to dispose of) and all the personal estate, be sold at such Credit, as my executors may deem best, and that the proceeds of the sales thereof and the debts due the Estate, be applied as follows: After paying all debts, owing against the estate, that the three daughters of my daughter Rachel Howard, have thirty dollars each, and the ^{two} daughters of my daughter Sally Thompson, thirty dollars each and that the balance of said funds, be divided as follows To wit, one fourth part to the children of my daughter Fanny Hall deceased, one fourth part to the children of my daughter Prescience Hall, as well those she may hereafter have, as those she already has, one fourth part to my daughter Sarah Garnett and one fourth part to my Grand son, Benjamin Hayden, and in case of his death without lawful issue, his part to be divided as is herein after provided— My Will is that all my land, not herein before disposed of be sold by my Executors at such
