Thirdly it is my desire that my stepmother Sarah Bell & my two sisters Fanny Robert & Elizabeth Bell should be entitled to the whole of my real and personal property of the above named three Legacies could Manage it is to keep the Negro part of the property divided I would prefer it but if they cannot it is my wish that they said Negro should be sold at twelve months - Credit as the Money divided between the last named Legacies given under my hand in the presence of the two subscribing Witnesses David Logan JB LL James Dods Junr

amongst all my Children or their Heirs forever
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Susannah Corvill one
Negro Woman by the name of Ely with all her future increase also
one feather Bed and furniture which said Negro Woman and Bed are
now in her possession which said Negro Bed I Give to her and her
Heirs forever
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Anderson Grubbs and
his Heirs forever one Negro Boy by the name of Reuben Also one
Feather Bed and furniture which said Negro and Bed are now
in his possession - Item I Give and bequeath unto my daughter
Mary Grubbs one Negro Woman named Hannah and her Child
Martha together with all their future increase also one feather
Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs forever
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Frances Ford one Negro
girl named Amy with all her future Increase also one feather
