I Robert Miller of the County of Warren & State of Kentucky do hereby make and give in my last will & testament in manner and form following to-wit: 1st. I will & bequeath to my Grandson Robert Miller Son of my son James Miller one hundred acres of land where I lived he the same more or less with all its appurtenances to him and his heirs forever and he and his heirs forever beginning at a Sugar-tree Shackberry corner to Leeper Survey at the mouth of the River running thence West 100 poles on my east & west line to a stake thence due South to my back line to a stake thence east 100 poles to a stone corner marked R. M. thence North to the Beginning provided however if any said Grandson should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years I will and bequeath the aforesaid one hundred acres to his sister Maria Elizabeth to her and her heirs forever, hereby reserving to my son James Miller the privilege of remaining on the said one hundred acres of land free of rent as long as he lives or it, and in case of the death of my son Robert Miller the same privilege to be extended to his widow during her widowhood, and whenever he gets living on said land from whatever cause I direct that a guardian shall be appointed for my grandson and in the event of his death before he comes of age then to my granddaughter Maria Elizabeth Miller aforesaid, who shall rent out said one hundred acres of land and appropriate the rents & profits thereof to the support & necessary education of my said grandson and in case of his death of any aforesaid granddaughter Maria Elizabeth Miller till he or she or it may happen shall arrive at the age of twenty one years - 2nd. I will and bequeath to my aforesaid granddaughter Maria Elizabeth Miller daughter of my son John Miller two back one Bureau one press one hundred bidlands & Henry Sleep - 3rd. I will and bequeath that whoever administers on my estate shall proceed shortly after my death to sell off

on a reasonable credit all the real & personal of my estate both real personal and mixed and after the payment of all my just debts and expenses together with what may be due and to be divided and distributed equally among my children and their descendants in case of any of their deaths in the same manner & estate and directed to be done in case of intestacy - In witness whereof I have signed at my hand and affixed my seal this the 28th Dec. 1842.

I give my wife Nancy Paper all the remainder of my estate both real & personal to have & to hold during her natural life after her death I give to my daughter Catharine Paper my Barren Captains & furrier too all my beds together with the stands and bed clothes also all my house hold and kitchen furniture - 3rd My wife & I desire is after the death of my said wife that the descendants of my daughter Betty Burgess and Nancy Enow my daughter receive the sum of twenty five dollars that is my daughter Nancy \$25 and the above named descendants \$25 which will make them equal with the descendants of my daughter Rachel Perkins & my daughter Elizabeth Hood and my daughter Mary Barnett which I have advanced \$25 each; I have also advanced to the following named children the several sums named to their respective parts: William Paper \$40 John Paper \$65 Robert Paper \$100 Enock Paper \$40 My daughter Margaret Paper \$40 Catharine Paper

in yellow Horns \$60. and Martha Shiry \$40 - It is my will and desire that none of those of my children who have herebefore the French term as above named receive nothing of my estate until all of my children or their descendants be made equal, then if there should be a remainder I want all of them to have equal portions of said remainder given under my hand this 10th day of October in the year of our Lord 1842.

I William Pedigo of the County of Warren & State of Kentucky being aware in body but of sound disposing mind and memory wish to dispose of this world's goods that has been placed to bless and with, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following - Item 1st It is my will after my death that my youngest daughter Lavinia Jane Pedigo shall have when she arrives at the age of twenty one year or marries seventy five dollars in Cash to purchase a horse, bridle & saddle, twenty dollars in Cash to purchase a bedstead head & footboard, eight dollars in Cash to purchase a cow & calf, and fifty dollars in Cash - also my two youngest sons Henry W. Pedigo & Eliza D. Pedigo when they arrive at the age of twenty one year or marry each one shall have seventy five dollars in Cash to purchase a horse, bridle and saddle and fifty dollars in Cash to be kept in money until the time or times before named to them and then have forever - Item 2d After my death it is my will that all my property both real and personal shall be sold by my executor and he or his executor to make all lawful conveyance to the pound, and the proceeds of such sale together with the Cash on hand, and all the Cash that may be due and by note or otherwise shall be collected by my executor if it can be done

and after giving off what is devised to my three youngest children before named in the said terms of this my last will all the balance of the proceeds of my estate shall be equally divided among all my children namely John Pedigo William Pedigo Sarah Bishop the wife of James B. Bishop Papa Pedigo Elizabeth Joseph the wife of Henry Joseph Martha Jane Mann the wife of James Mann George W. Pedigo Eliza D. Pedigo and Lavinia Jane Pedigo to them and their heirs forever hereby revoking all former wills by me made - Item 3d I constitute and appoint Joseph B. C. my sole executor to execute and carry out effect this my last will & testament - Item 4th I direct the County Court or any Court this may come before not to demand any security whatever of my said executor Joseph B. C. his property standing bonds for his faithful performance in executing this my last will & testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused my last to be signed this 16th day of January 1845.

Item 5th Whereas my son Papa acts disobedient with me at this and at other times believing he do not deserve an equal share with the balance of my children therefore my executor is to take fifty dollars out of the 1st Papa Pedigo portion and divide it between my son John Pedigo and Sarah Bishop the wife of James B. Bishop twenty five dollars each to be paid the day and date in the fourth Item
