 Will I desire all men by these presents that are acquainted with the will of my late husband James Robinson deceased, I Sally Robinson of the County of Edmonson State of Kentucky being sound in mind do hereby make & ordain this my last will & testament, And do hereby revoke all former wills, &c.

1st I give to my daughter Betty the following negroes viz. Buckingham, Maudlin, Marline & children & Martha & her child one bed & furniture.

2nd I give to my daughter Sally I desire the following negroes viz. Jackson, Lennis, Sally Ann & also my interest in the carriage.

3rd I give to my grand daughter Mary Ellen Payne the following negroes Hamilton, Robert & Willard.

4th I wish my daughter to have my negro man John during my life. And at my death I wish his value to be equally divided between my two daughters Elizabeth & Sally who he has a wife & children. I do not wish him sold publicly but that he be allowed to choose if my daughters so direct & choose and be sold at auction.

5th I wish my old negro woman Mary to have a home with my daughter Sally & if she dies after my death I wish her to be provided for by my two daughters.

The foregoing writing purporting to be the last will & testament of Sally Robinson deceased was at the last and highest open court of said County in due form of law by the oath of Geo. W. Parker one of the subscribing witnesses thereto & the same was duly proven in due form of law by the oath of said Parker the other subscribing witness thereto. Whereupon the same was ordered to be recorded as the last will & testament of said Sally Robinson deceased. All this done at the County of Edmonson, Kentucky this 11th day of February 1854.

I James David of the County of Warren & State of Kentucky do make and constitute this my last will & testament in manner & form following to wit: 1st I give & bequeath to my brother Bezwil Bell & his wife one acre of land where he now live

2nd My will & desire is that the remainder of my tract of land on which I now live shall be equally divided between my three children, David, Amanda, Jane Bell in Demand at Johnsville Richard A. Buckner David My further will & desire is that if my son come at my death is living that my son Richard & son in law Bezwil Bellman have an in joint partnership and that they pay to my other son in law Wiley Lewisell twenty dollars the remainder of my personal estate after my just debts & funeral expenses is paid be equally divided between them my before mentioned children.
