

Thas of my estate; but the said negro is to be held by Christopher Tompkins Jr. in trust for my daughter as of and to her, her heirs and assigns. I have Christopher Tompkins Jr. the said negro and also all my said daughter share of my estate of what nature soever in trust for the said and benefit of my said daughter Emily and her heirs. Now: It is further my will, that as to the part which may be allotted to my wife for her dower, all my land in a situation at my death to be occupied or cultivated and also my ten years of the aforementioned shall be rented out by my executors from time to time until my youngest child shall arrive at the age of twenty one years; but in order to be made for a longer term, than eight years at a time. Now: It is my desire that all the real estate owned at the year of my death and also all purchased, or hereafter shall be purchased and finished and then sold in such manner and in such terms as my executors may deem expedient; I further desire that the said land which remains and all the tools belonging to said farm pass. Now: It is my will that as soon as my youngest child shall come of age all my said estate shall be divided among all my children or if they shall so agree the said lands shall be sold and the money equally divided as aforesaid. Now: It is my desire that my negro woman Emily may live with her children at the same place. If she shall survive my wife but during the life of my said wife the said negro woman Emily is to live with her. Now: I give to my daughter Emily I have the amount of my account against the said James the husband of 1822 p. 74 to come out of his part of my estate. Now having given now I have to Sarah Birdsell which I estimate at the value of thirty dollars. It is my will that said sum of thirty dollars be deducted out of my part of my estate. Now: I bequeath to my son Carlton, my little that I own which he is to have paying over and above his equal share of my estate. Now: I give to my wife Elizabeth four feather beds, furniture and so much of my household & kitchen furniture & farming utensils as she may think necessary for her use.

Now of my said negro woman Emily should at any time become unable to labour she is to be comfortable maintained out of my estate. And it is my will and desire that my three youngest children Carlton Rebecca & James shall receive a good English education the expense thereof to be defrayed by my estate and not to be charges against my said children or deduction out of their or either of their parts of my estate. Now: I do hereby make let and annul all and every will, wills by me heretofore made and finally I do hereby constitute and appoint Christopher Tompkins Jr. and Christopher Tompkins Jr. of said County Executor of the my last will and Testament, the testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name this 17th day of April 1825. I also give unto said John Edmund the following property to wit: Negroes Fido (or Fido) and his children Martha, Thomas, Mary, Amanda and Thaddeus, and the increase of said female slaves during my natural life also I do give to Fido's children and their increase in like manner.

also half my flock of cattle at my decease.
my Cart and Wagon oxen, all my Sheep hogs goats.
the horses and pig all the crop of Corn wheat, oats &c
of which I may die before of his estate & all my
Cattle car of furniture and notes of John McLaughlin
and John J. Minn amounting to one hundred &
twenty five Dollars also all my farming tools all
my household kitchen furniture & what ever after
I die also all other property of which I may die
I have great personal interest in not having my
specifically devised & bequeathed to John J. Minn
bequeathed to George John Parks one half of land of
about forty one acres with South Part of House &c
near Glasgow which I purchased of Wm. Wash.
also negro man Peter and eleven other negro women
children and her increase during my natural life
and one acre border called a May and one pole on
William Thompson of Nashville for five hundred
Dollars. I give and bequeath to George Gibson
Wife of Thomas Gibson of Memphis and the
heirs of her body one house and lot adjoining to it in
the town of Glasgow in the Street which purchased
by me of said Thomas Gibson and was occupied
by C. Allen Lewis also one negro man named Israel
negro woman Mary and Hannah her two half my
flock of cattle, one hand at my death and one
Dogs little French dog and bequeathed to Nathaniel
Nichols Parks one negro man named Sam. and his
son Calounn and all my hogs, Kitties, F. fish &c give
and bequeath to John J. Minn one hundred and
half dollars amounting to his Dollars & twenty five
cents to be paid to him by my Executors whenever I
shall shall collect and have together at and the
same time that amount in six and of one cent
pieces I wish all my debts at my decease my funeral
expences and the Bequest to John J. Minn as to
be laid out of the property herein bequeathed, to
John J. Minn & his heirs &c. I do hereby constitute & appoint
General James Parks Executor of this my last will & testament
and request and direct that he shall not give any
kind of security as my Executor.
