during her life time or widowhood Except such property as
I shall otherwise bequeath. Also I give and bequeath unto my
son & the Gent my son Samuel Gent his horse & saddle for
the use of riding or him a saddle & also I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Elizabeth Gent one bed bed and furniture
likewise one bed & some rags bed and as for my other Woman
Sarah She is to serve my wife Sarah Gent during her widow-
hood and at the end of her widowhood the said Mrs. Woman shall
have as far as the that she shall go to live with any
one of my children that she pleases to live with and if she
gets it and will of my desire is that in my senior daughter
that she live with shall maintain her during her life time
and as for my other daughter she is to serve my wife Sarah Gent
next one year day and then after that she is to be free for twelve
years from next one year day and after that her to be free and
the master to be to her freedom according to law and
her time is to be equally divided among all my children and
if there should remain of my fathers Estate coming to me from
North Carolina I want it to be equally divided among all
my children and all the Estate in kind and property left to my
son during his widowhood when she always at her death
is to be sold and equally divided among all my children
Except my wife Sarah Gent and I do hereby attorney disclaim
whole and absolute all and every other former Testament, will
bequeath and devise by me before named written
and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last Will and Testament. Also I constatly desire
Maggie and Benjamin Bell to be executors of this my
last Will and Testament for whom I have hereto
set my hand and seal this sixtenth of Feb
