In the presence of God & before I Samuel Gentry of Barren
County and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of perfect
mind and memory thank be given to God, calling unto mind the over-
tality of my life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is
to say as touching such worldly estate which it has pleased
God to bestow on me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form
First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Gentry my
good bed and furniture and her wardrobe to dispose of them
at her death as she thinks proper. Also I give to my
well beloved wife Sarah Gentry all my Estate real and personal
during her life time or widowhood except such property as
I shall hereinafter bequeath; Also I give and bequeath unto my
son or the survivor one good Horse & harness fifteen dollars for
the use of sitting of him a saddle. Also I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Elizabeth Gentry one good bed and furniture
& harness one good Sewing Machine and as for my Negro Woman
Judge she is to serve my Wife Sarah Gentry during her widow-
hood and at the end of her widowhood the said Negro Woman Judge
shall be free so far as this that she shall go to live with any
one of my children that she please to live with and if she
wants to and wish of my desire is that my son or daughter
that she lives with shall maintain her during her life time
and as for my Negro Slave Dick he is to serve my wife Sarah until
next new year day and then after that he is to be hired for twelve
months from next new year day and after that time he is to be free and
the Director is to be to his freedom according to law and
his hire is to be equally divided among all my children and
if there should be any of my father's Estate coming to me from
North Carolina I want it to be equally divided among all
my children and all the Estate land and personal left to my
wife during her widowhood when she dies it at her death
is to be sold and equally divided among all my children
except my Negro Woman Judge and I do hereby utterly disclaim
revokes and annuls all and every other former Testament wills
devises bequeaths and donations by me here named made
and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last Will and Testament. Also I constitute John
Clappett and Benjamin Coleman my sole Executors of this my
last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and foot this sixth day of Feb.
