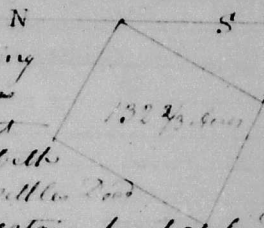

I Isaac Lewis of Barren County and State of Kentucky
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the
form following Viz first it is my will that the whole of my
estate after my debts are paid shall remain in the hands
of my wife Sally Lewis for the use and benefit of her and my Children
so long as she shall remain a Widow under the direction of my
Executors hereinafter mentioned secondly it is my Will that if my Wife
shall hereafter marry and my Executors shall think it will be to
the advantage of my children for my estate to remain in the
hands of my Wife after marriage and the proceeds thereof be
applied to the education and benefit of my children they
shall remain so until the youngest child shall reach
the age of 21 years but if any of my said children
shall marry it is my Will that my Executors shall have them as
much of my personal estate as in their opinions can be spared
from the support of the remaining part of the family to be
accounted for as they when a division of the whole of my
estate shall take place It is my Will that when my young-
est child shall come to age that my estate shall be equally
divided amongst my said children reserving to my Wife
her third part her life time which third part shall be at
her Death divided equally amongst my said children It is
my Will that my Executors shall also pay out of my personal
estate to pay the state price of the tract of land
