and weak in body but of sound and perfect mind.
will Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty
of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly
affairs and thereby be the better prepared to face the world
when it shall please God to call me hence do therefore
make and publish this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following (That is to say)
First and principally I Commit my soul to God and
my body to the earth to be decently buried at the
discretion of my Executor hereinafter named and after
my debts and funeral charges are paid I bequeath and
bequeath as follow -

First my will is that after my Debts and Funeral
Charges are paid out of my personal property I
give and bequeath the balance all and singular
that is left to my negro woman Lane and secondly
my will is that my negro woman Lane and her
two daughters Lucinda and Susan dona shall all
and singular be free and emancipated to all
intents and purposes as I have no Relations
whom I would wish to have them to adhere third
I hereby nominate and appoint Oliver Hamilton
of the County & State aforesaid my Executor to this
my last will and Testament in witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
seal this 20th day of January in the year of our Lord
