10 In the name of God Amen I Samuel Marshall of Barren County & State of Kentucky being of sound mind & memory do make Constitute and Ordain that my last will and testament hereby revoking all others - Improving all my debts which are very few and but small to be speedily & promptly paid, and the bequest hereafter bequeathed are to be discharged as soon as circumstances permit and in the

manner directed. I then it is my will and desire that my beloved wife Abigail Marshall shall possess and inherit the following property for and during her natural life to wit one negro man named Lewis and a negro girl named Cinderella and at her death the above named negroes shall descend to her five children forever to wit James Harmon Marshall Mary Fann Marshall Robert Fowler Marshall Rachel Margaret Marshall Sarah Ellenides Marshall to be equally divided between them but with this reserved that my son Robert I Marshall shall be particularly attended to to have a support &c. - It is further my will and desire that the balance of my property to wit shall be disposed in manner I found that my three daughters above named Mary, Rachel & Sarah E Marshall shall have a horse saddle bridle & blanket & a cow bedstead bed & furniture to make them equal with my other daughters that are married over & above the property named - I then it is my will & desire that my beloved wife in addition to what I have bequeathed to her that she shall enjoy the plantation on which I live during her natural life time for the purpose of supporting my son Robert I Marshall, and in case he should out live his mother that he shall be supported out of the proceeds of the above named property - I then it is my will and desire that my beloved wife shall have as much timber as shall be sufficient to keep up the buildings & fences on said farm that is to say the old survey including the land which I bought from William Bennett - I then it is my will and desire that the property which I have not yet disposed of shall be sold on such Credit as my executors may think proper and the proceeds equally divided between my beloved wife giving her a share part in addition to what I have already bequeathed with all my children John C Marshall Ahm Marshall Andrew Marshall Elizabeth Marshall Samuel Marshall James H Marshall Robert I Marshall Mary Fann Marshall Rachel M Marshall & Sarah E Marshall.
