Testament in manner following first of all I wish my Executor
to sell part of my stock to pay all my just Debts
Item I give to David Chapman the field that William Lewis now has in
in Cato for five years and he Chapman may clear four or five
Acres of the pleasure
Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Rose all the
balance of my estate real and personal during her life and
at her death my Will is for David Chapman to have all my land
which is about one hundred Acres and at my wife death furnish
my Executor all the personal estate which shall be left amongst
my wife three Children equally between them and last of all I
leave my friend Mr. H. H. Davidson my whole and sole Executor
as witness as witness I have set my hand and seal this thirtieth
day of June 1823.
