 now occupies 30 acres and also two hundred
 acres lying in Warren County to be divided
 between my daughters named as follows

 daughter Julia Ann Dickerson is to have the
 amount of \$36.00 thirty five dollars instead
 of her land call for also a mare
 and buggy and also a feather bed
 and bedding to put her at ease with my
 other daughter also to my son Wm.
 Dickerson eight head of Lard all per-
 ishable property and at my death the
 proceeds of the sale after my debts is paid
 to be equally divided 2/3rds the said Wm.
 Dickerson had to support his mother until
 death it is my wish that Helen W. and
 Julia Ann Dickerson should pay Nancy
 Martha their portions & which be paid

I Samuel W. Harrison being sensible of the uncer-
 tainty of life, and wishing to make a disposition
 of all the property that God has thought proper to
 vouch safe unto me do, make and publish my
 last will and testament as follows to wit
 First my will is that my wife Mary Harrison rem-
 ain in my family residence it being the place
 I now reside upon until my son Alexander Nelson
 Harrison arrives at the age of Twenty one years,
 and then said residence including all the ground
 deeded to me by Dennis Lockhart in 1827 suppos-
 ed to be 20 acres be sold my said wife having
 her dower out of the proceeds of the sale of said
 residence and land, and it is further my will
 and desire that the said dower interest of my said
 wife shall be paid over to the Judge of the Barren
 County Court who is hereby authorized to select and
 appoint some suitable and discreet person to take
 charge of said fund for me and to manage said
 fund for the best interest and advantage of my said

Wife, and to pay over to her out of the interest arising upon said fund such sums and at such times as she may need it for her support and comfort, and at the death of my said wife it is my will & desire that said fund arising from her dower interest as above described excepting the interest that shall have been paid out to my said wife be paid over in equal proportions to my two sons Samuel Harrison & Orastus Wilson Harrison or to their legal representatives

Second. I bequeath to my son Andrew J. Harrison Twenty five

Thirdly I give & bequeath to my son George W. Harrison One Hundred dollars, and also my interest in a Threshing machine he paying all outstanding bills against me on account of said machine

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my two sons Samuel Harrison and Orastus Wilson Harrison all the residue of my Estate of every description and kind whatever my Subject however to the one third part which the law gives to the widow of an intestate which third part of all my Estate I desire to be placed in the hands of the Judge of the Barren County Court and by him to be placed in the hands of a suitable trustee and the fund to be managed precisely as the fund mentioned in the first clause of this will is required to be managed & that is such parts of the interest thereof as may be necessary for the support & comfort of my said wife during life be paid over to her, and at her death to be divided as the fund mentioned in said first clause is directed to be divided

Fifthly I desire that my two sons Samuel and Orastus W. Harrison have the whole of my personal tools free from any claims upon them either by my wife as dower interest therein or by my administrator

Sixthly I hereby authorize my friend John Burlew of Boyle County to sell and convey any land or interest in Land which I own in Boyle County Kentucky, and if he fails and refuses to act thus, and in that event I authorize the administrator on my Estate to make said sale and conveyance, the proceeds thereof to be paid over according to the foregoing provisions of this will.

I also authorize my said administrator to sell and convey the property mentioned in the first clause of this will when the time designated shall arrive
