Old and infirm in body but of sound mind and memory and
well knowing, according to the course of human events a disposition
of my mortal body and estate to take place and wishing to make
a just distribution of such estate as it hath
pleased the almighty Father of the Universe to bless me with
to hereby make this my last will and testament in witness
whereof I have written my will and estate as that after my funeral
expenses and just debts are paid that my son John Black
shall be charged with two hundred and fifty dollars being
what he has received for my son Joseph Black the exchange with
Robert John Morris for the land to which he has been
now lives and that the heirs hereafter named shall in equal
in their proportion of my estate what said John has received and
that balance of my said Estate if any to be equally divided between
said John and said Robert Morris and said John shall so the effect
to be made equal to said John Black being to the heirs of my
daughter said John Black two hundred and fifty dollars
to be paid but their respective proportions of it so that they taking
all together shall have as much as first mentioned as my son John
has received and that my grand daughter Susannah Black and my
grand son James Robert Morris shall have two hundred and fifty
dollars equally divided between them to make them as heirs of
my daughter said John Black equal to what my son John Black
has received as above and to my son Henry Black as he has
leave one dollar in full of his or three parts of my estate
I also leave the same sum to my son Thompson Black or his heirs
and to my daughter Susannah Black or her heirs the same
sum of one dollar in full of his or their part of my
estate and in order to raise the names of said Henry and
paying to those whom I have made bequest I desire that the
Land whereon I now reside shall be sold to the highest bidder
in two or more lots and the purchase money paid with
approved security and further that my negro man Henry Black
shall be sold but until they are sold my wife and that when
they shall be emancipated but said shall be forty years of
age or not when Henry is as he will not be said Henry to be
free when Henry is and request and desire is that of said
heirs of my daughter said John Black and said shall have received
as much as shall make them as before specified equal to
my son John Black that then the residue of my
my estate arising from the sale of said Henry
I will give my negro man and lands the sale of said

Shall be equally divided between my son John
 Claiborne his heirs and the heirs of said. Mary and all
 my children to be named here, so that the heirs of each of
 them which shall be collected shall not be so divided
 as my said John or his heirs and lastly John Claiborne

 divided equally as follows. I have said with my beloved
 wife Elizabeth H. Black the tract of land on which I now
 reside or some thereof at the together with my executor
 hereon after named may now necessary to her use together
 with all my plantation tools that she may now and for ever
 have of acres at the Stock of hay &c.

and horse and cattle she may now and for ever have of
 except such articles as are herein after mentioned and disposed of
 all the remaining effects of goods and other provisions lawfully for family
 use as so much as may be necessary for the use of the family
 I have said. I give unto my daughter Mary Emma and my son
 named John Claiborne future increase, one horse saddle & bridle
 one feather bed & furniture one and all new in her possession
 to her and her heirs forever. I have said. I give unto my daughter
 Elizabeth wife of Nathaniel H. Blackman the tract of land on which
 they now reside containing about twenty one and a half acres during
 her natural life her heirs forever. I have said. I give unto my
 one son during the life of my son John Claiborne and his heirs forever
 I give the same to her children and their heirs forever and I further bind
 that my executor shall charge my said daughter Elizabeth with the
 balance of a bond of \$80 due her from her husband John H. Blackman
 also with the further sum of \$36 which I gave for the abatement of
 land when sold under an execution against said John H. Blackman
 together with interest thereon the day of sale to wit in 1835
 the above seem to be set off against my part which may become
 due my said daughter Elizabeth shall be as the said daughter
 children die without marriage or without heirs of theirs;
 body then my will and desire is that said tract of land shall be sold
 and the proceeds equally divided among said my children & their
 heirs the abatement of said interest equal to what I have otherwise
 given to my daughter Mary Emma and my son John Claiborne
 my daughter Susan & George and are now paid by the name of Mary
 with all her future increase also the sum of fifty dollars to be paid
 out of my estate to make up the said equal in value to what
 has been given my other daughter Vanney and Elizabeth
 also one feather bed & furniture bed and saddle and one and all
 new in her possession to her & her heirs forever. I have said. I give unto
 my daughter Harriet H. Blackman one negro woman by the name
 of Harriet together with all her clothes & furniture partly belonging
 to Elizabeth in said negro woman & her house in my possession until my
 said daughter Harriet shall marry. I have said. I give unto my
 John H. Blackman one horse saddle and bridle new in his possession
 also one negro girl by the name of Martha now in his possession & I have
 said. I give unto my son Nathaniel H. Blackman also negro girl
 named Jane with all her future increase. I have said. I give unto
 my son William Jackson H. Blackman one negro girl named Ciza
 with all her future increase. I have said. I give unto my son
 Stephen Labare H. Blackman one negro girl named Emily with all her
