If there should then be any thing remaining after paying off the before named sum it is my Will that the balance be equally divided between my three sons James M. Black, Thomas Black & William W. Black.

It is my wish and desire if my Son can conveniently keep my black people in the family that he do. It is my will and desire that my Executor or Executors convey the fifty acres of land to my Son James M. Black and the residue of my land to the purchaser or purchasers making them as good and perfect a title as I could now do myself.

I have heretofore given my Son James M. Black my Scho. gun which I do not wish charged to him out of his portion of my Estate.

Lastly I appoint my Son William W. Black and my friend Henry Eubank Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others.

I Susanm^h Eubank of Warren County Kentucky do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner as follows, that is to say

First I do hereby manumit and set free from Slavery

by my own negro Slaves, Lovell, Sam about thirty

years old Royal is about twenty seven years

old John about fifteen years of age, Harison about

Thirteen years old. My desire and will is that the said Tom and Ned and John and Harriett be hired out for the term of one year next after my decease and that the money arising from said hire be handed over to said negroes respectively to enable them to emigrate to Liberia and that said Tom, Ned, John and Harriett be discharged from servitude and be thence forth and forever free from and after one year from the time of my death. But should my death occur at a time of the year so that they cannot obtain a passage to Liberia within three months after their year of hiring shall have expired then in that case they shall be hired for a period reaching up to within three months of the time when a passage can be obtained for them to Liberia and the money arising from the hire appropriated as above to sending them to Liberia.

Second I give and bequeath all my Slaves not above mentioned to my Grand Son Joseph Eubank and my Granddaughter Susan Dodd and their heirs forever. I also give to my Grand Son and Granddaughter above named and their heirs all my Lands and I also give them all my perishable property of every description the whole real and personal to be equally divided between my two said Grandchildren.

Third I desire that my two Grandchildren give to their father Richard Eubank a decent & comfortable support out of what I have given to them during his natural life and also that his wife Lucy Eubank be supported in the same way so long as she continues to live if her husband Richard Eubank be alive and if he die before she does then after his death she shall be supported in the same way during her widowhood.

And lastly I appoint my Grandson Joseph Eubank and William Dodd Executors of this will hereby revoking all others.

I (William J. Abbott of the County of Darwin and State of Kentucky do make and publish this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following, to wit: I say,

1st I give and bequeath unto my only Son William J. Abbott the Slave tract of Land on which I now live together with all the appurtenances thereto and belonging.

2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Metcalfe my Cotton tract of Land on which she now lives together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging. It is my wish & desire that my first set of children and my two children above named which was by my second wife should be made equal in all the property both real and personal. But recollecting that my first wife's father made some kind of a deed of gift to his daughter, of a negro girl which is the mother & Grand Mother of all the Slaves I now hold and not being fully advised of the nature & extent of that deed of gift I say that upon the condition that said deed is void under the Law or does not extend further than to the said black woman named in said deed then and in that case I desire that all the negroes I now hold should be equally divided between my daughter Nancy Metcalfe and the children of my daughter Sally Handy dec'd and my two children (Lafayette and John) in valuation is made of the two tracts of Land so as to make an equal division amongst them and if said negroes cannot be divided so as
