Truly if my wife Mary Payne, should die, before my youngest children comes of age, I wish there to be a sale, as I have said, and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided among my children, Elizabeth Payne, Joseph Payne, Edmund Payne, Lucetta Payne, Nathaniel Payne and Vincent Payne to be enjoyed by them forever & they if my wife Mary Payne, should continue to live a widow until my youngest children comes of age, I wish her to have one half of my plantation including the houses, Orchard, and six Acres of Woodland beginning at the upper end of the Apple Orchard, and running towards the meadow for Liberty and also my negro slave Bob, and one fourth part of the perishable property during her natural life, and then to return to my children as aforementioned and to be equally divided among them, and the balance of my estate, and the balance of my estate sold when my youngest children comes of age - If any of my children should have one more than another before the sale I wish it then made equal. - I wish my four youngest children: Lucetta, Joseph, Vincent to have schooling as much as is convenient. - I would wish the money that I have in hand to be made the best use of in the best manner it can for the support of the family also what is owing to me. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends William Parks, Samuel Parks and Reuben Payne Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Fredericktown, 19th August 1825.

The Vaughn In the name of God amen I being in my proper mind and knowing my Will myself frail, and liable to death hath this day gave and delivered unto Joanna Vaughn, my daughter, for the Love and affection that I bear for her all of my stock which is one bay horse and one bay mare, also three head of Cattle, which is two Cows, and one calf I also gave and deliver unto the said Joanna Vaughn, my daughter, all my other property containing all of my household and kitchen furniture which the said Joanna Vaughn is to have and to be clear of any incumbrances claim or claims in or through any person or persons, whomever. I also give to Reuben Vaughn, son of my wife Mary Wadsworth Thomas Vaughn's heirs, and Henry Vaughn's heirs, Ruth Henty Vaughn's heirs, William Vaughn and Lolly Carter, or as many of them as will, support a Law suit, against Andrew Barnett, to recover back the land, that said Andrew Barnett dispossessed me of it being the land I bought of John

I desire that the property herein devised to my three children aforesaid may be paid and delivered to them respectively upon their marriage or coming of age and that in the mean time the said property be managed & preserved for their benefit by my Executors herein after named;

Now to prevent all doubt and misconstruction I do hereby declare it to be my Will and desire that all my property both Real & Personal be held and enjoyed by my Wife and three children already named in manner herein before mentioned to the entire exclusion of my other two children John James & Burdickson as they the said John James and Burdickson have been heretofore fully provided for by me. - Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Judith Executrix; and my young friends Thomas L. Bradford, Executors of this my Last Will & Testament - In Testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name & affixed my seal this 19th day of July, in the year of our Lord 1822
