I James S. Wade sign of Barren County, Ky. being in ill health but blessed with my right reason do make this my last will and Testament and let Justice my spirit to god who gave it, 1st that all debts due me be collected and all my debts be paid, 2nd I gave and bequeath to my dear wife Sally M. Wade the tridel of land what we are now living on and two Negroes (the boy Nick and the girl Minda) two horses, two cows, as many of the farming tools as she may need and a supply of provisions for the consumption of her family until she can raise a crop. with other stock such as a family would need as much of household and kitchen furniture, as she may want during her life and at her death to be sold and equally divided between my sons also gave my calf One Year of Oxen and the Wagon to be disposed in the same manner as the other property I left her 4th I gave to my son David Wade the tract of land that he is now living on containing 33 acres more or less I also charge him with one hundred and fifty three dollars as part of his portion of my estate 5th I gave to my daughter Mary I Give an equal portion with the rest of my children. I also charge her with seventy one dollars as a part of her portion of my estate. 6th I gave to my sons William E Wade and my son James S Wade and my daughter Elizabeth V Laranes an equal portion of my estate with the above named David and Mary before they receive any thing more and thus an equal division between them all 7th I do hereby constitute and appoint James

her body three hundred & thirty two her two children
named Mary I am also \$500.00 in money or cash
notes One bed & furniture One Horse One horse
Saddle & bridle also One fourth part part of a
tract of land I am entitled to in the State of
Texas containing 148 1/2 acres lying in the County
of Harrison all of which properly sufficient
I do give and bequeath for the life of the said
Mary Sanford the legal heirs of her own body &c
I bequeath to my grand son John Tho^s
Sanford two slaves Jasper aged 24 years & Maria
aged 15 years old also the balance of money or cash
notes may have at my death after paying the
above sum of \$500.00 out of the same I do suppose
to be between eight hundred & a thousand dollars
also the fourth part of the above tract of land
in the State of Texas containing 148 1/2 acres
I do give and bequeath to the other half of the said land
I bequeath to my other two named children sons
of my son Frederick Davidson. I do give and bequeath

Revised & Lewis Davison to each one fourth of aforesaid
 Acres land forever Re. Then Wth I bequeath my, son
 Arnden Davison all my Clothing, watch, books &c
 the said Arnden Davison having, received his full
 portion herefrom of the estate &c and I do hereby constitute
 & appoint Tho^s Helm and Robert Mann of Barron
 County, Wisconsin, my lawful executors to this my last
