I Thomas Hardy of Barren County & Commonwealth of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory do Enstate this my last will and Testament in form and manner following Viz
 Item 1st I Give my Spirit into the hand of God from whom it came and my Body I give to the Earth to be buried according to the Rites of my Country & I do hereby appoint where I wish it to lie until the morning of the Resurrection at what time my Soul and Body shall be again reunited and I am with Angels (I hope) to sing the praises of my Redeemer through all Eternity. Also my bodily God I desire and Bequeath to the use follows Viz

Item 2nd It is my wish and Desire that all Debts due me shall be collected as soon as possible and the balance of my Estate shall admit of and the money apply to the payment of my Debts to the money arising from the sales two there are among Hogs as can be conveniently spared from the use of the Family the remaining sum to be applied the same way (that is the paying my just debts)

Item 3rd I Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary all my debts remaining after my Debts are paid to her use and Disposal for Item 4th I Give to my beloved wife Mary during her natural life four feather Beds & Furniture & all my House hold and Kitchen furniture Plantation & elsewhere &c

Item 5th I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her natural life one Bay Horse called Lady one Bay gelding called Blufford and one Saddle belt that came out of a saddle that I have given to my daughter Mary Birk. Item 6th I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife for her use and support during her natural life three horses and calves with their harness also my stock of Hogs (except the unweaned mentioned) to be for her use and Disposal for life

Item 7th All the property that I have lent to my beloved wife as above mentioned that remains at her Death shall be equally divided between my sons Viz George Hardy & Rudimen Hardy equally divided between them as they may think proper

Item 8th Whar I have heretofore given unto my children Viz Rhoda Hardy Thomas Hardy John Hardy Charles Hardy & Mary Birk their full portions I think it needful to say any thing more concerning them I am glad

I constitute and appoint my Wife Mary Hardy Executor and George Hardy Executor of this my last will and Testament and do by these present words and Testament all other wills & Testaments by me heretofore made and to be made to be my only one given from under my hand and seal this 10th day of August in the year of our Lord 1811

I do Intend on the second line of the 1st Item with these words (that remains) before signed signed seal and with witnesses to be the said Thomas Hardy Hardy last will & Testament in presence of

Reasons I hereby make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
Beginning as followeth viz. I Give and be-

more or less One Negro slave called Boney bridle and
Saddle one Horse Sack all the Year with one Plant
and have one wedding hoe three bushels Calves three
Gows and Lambs all the stock of Hogs & all the House
hold & Kitchen furniture to have and to hold
during her single life or Widow hood

Item All the residue of my Estate not mentioned I wish to be to the best advantage & after my just Debt paid I wish applied to the maintaining & schooling of all my children equally to them their Heirs and assigns forever provided my beloved Wife shall intermarry my wish and desire is that all that I have or come to except the Land shall be sold and equally divided between all my Children provided my wife shall intermarry my wish & desire is the Land should be equally divided between my two sons, Joseph and James Fisher, to them their Heirs and assigns forever

Therely nominal, and appoint Samuel Langdon
and my wife Polly Executors to this my last will and
Testament Given my hand at this last day of
April 1812.
