 dollars, after that I will be my wife all of my second
 & my gross land John Deane & Lundy Cash & Cash notes
 household & kitchen furniture & my stock of every kind
 wherein I have bought John Matthews and J. S. Matthews
 interest in the four slaves that were sold on the 14th day of
 December 1841 that belongs to the estate of James Matthews
 dec. & also my own claim Sewell to my wife during her
 life & at her death she is to have, six hundred dollars two
 beds & furniture one cow & calf one large table one
 bureau & shot gun to sell and do with as she may
 think proper at her death, the whole amount to be sold
 & equally divided among all of my brother & sisters, wherein
 Allen Matthews has bound himself in an obligation to pay
 to the heirs of James Matthews dec. his share of the
 death of my mother for the ^{same} property I also will my

225 portion of what amount to Allen Matthews alone in testimony
