I, James P. Lord of Barren County Kentucky do hereby certify of the propriety of making preparation for my deposition which in all probability is drawing near and being of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others

1st I bequeath my will that all my just debts be paid by my executor herein after named

2 I desire and bequeath to my brother Hanielah Lord and all my real estate including my negro boy David

3 I desire that my executor collect all the debts due me and they are hereby directed to pay out to William Trigg to

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be held by him in trust for the use and benefit of my mother all the money which may come to him in which may not be needed to pay my debts or to be used in the course of administration and any surplus of property not herein particularly specified I desire and bequeath to William Trigg to be held in trust as before directed for the use and benefit of my mother as she may want it

4 And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my friend B. D. Crump and my cousin Hanielah Lord executors of this my last will and testament In testimony all which I have hereunto set my hand this 12th day of August 1836

In the name of God Amen I Thomas W. Wade of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky being now in the fully third year of my age & being sound in body but of sound mind and disposing memory and knowing the uncertainty of life and the solemnity of death do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament hereby and the first place I feel disposed to be recommended to all the dealings of business with me and therefore I resign my body and spirit freely to the hands of the great Author of my existence

Secondly I do hereby direct that my worldly goods be disposed of in the following manner first I desire that as early as convenient after my decease all my perishable property should be sold at public auction on such credit as my executors may think best and that my just debts and funeral expenses be settled as early as convenient

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane W. Wade one third part of my estate to select such articles as she may want at valuation or by purchase as she may think best and as a portion to one third part I do give to her my old black man George and negro girl Malinda to have and to hold said property or estate during her natural life

and in case our children print heirs between us should
be precious to her death without issue then and in that
case she is at liberty to dispose of as she may like one
thousand dollars worth of the money obtained from my estate

I Now I give to the children landfull heirs of my brother Telling
I Wade a certain tract or portion of land lying on Coler creek
and bounded as follows beginning at a large eye-bore on
the West bank of the Dry fork near the road about one hundred
yards above the mouth thereof a straight line to the North east
corner of the Cornfield lying in the direction to Jacob Smith's
old place thence a straight line to a stake three hundred
yards east of the Jacob Smith's spring branch on the military
line or my father's one thousand acre survey thence east to the
Cypress between my father's lands & Coler creek thence with my
father's old line to his beginning corner in the fork of the creek
near the blue spring thence down the middle of Coler creek
to two mouth of the Dry fork thence up the Dry fork to the
beginning - provided that my aged father Benjamin Wade is
to have and enjoy the use and control of said tract of land
for and during his natural life to till or rent out the land
and have whatever timber on my lands I also give to my
brother Telling I Wade notes and securities I hold against
him amounting to between \$200 & \$300 but if my said brother
be commenced against my estate by law and Telling I Wade
his executors heirs or any of them on account of a negro girl
named Vinny hired by my father to said T I Wade or on any
other account concerning my father's estate then the bond mentioned
in this item is to be retained or so much thereof as will be
sufficient to satisfy all cost & damage and pay off the above
named bonds and securities

I Now I give to my brother William I Wade the rents and
profits of 200 acres of land on which Samuel Lee Jr has
just taken a lease for five years & said lease is not to be
interrupted until out but in case the S W I Wade should
institute or cause to be instituted any suit or suits against my
estate then and in that case he is not to be entitled to any benefit
arising from said lease but I will and direct if no such suits are
commenced the said W I Wade should have a child or children
that the said 200 acres of land be conveyed to said child or
children

I Now I give to my aged father the old negro woman
Rumay to dispose of as he may think proper at his death, also
he is to retain the use and control of the house hold and kitchen

furniture now in his possession during his life

I Now I give to my children all my estate both real & personal not
otherwise herein disposed of to them and their heirs forever but in
case my children should all die without issue then I desire that
all the estate lawfully belonging to my heirs shall go & descend
to the children of brother Telling I Wade being the lawfull
heirs of S I Wade

I constitute and appoint my friends H P Maxwell & Alex Young
my executors to settle and adjust the affairs of my estate after
my death and as my will by request of my beloved wife that
her dower in lands be kind of in a piece of ground so to
include the dwelling house where she now lives instead of laying
share out of the various funds belonging to the estate
