I William Bishop being Weak in Body but of a sound mind and knowing the certainty of Death and uncertainty of Life I do hereby Make and Ordain this as my last Will and Testament I send, In the first place I desire to resign my Soul to God that I have, and as for what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow on me after the payment of my Just Debts I give and Bequeath in the following manner first I lend to my beloved Wife Rebecca Bishop all my Estate both real and personal I during her life after her Death I give to my son Lowry Bishop one Dollar also I give to my Daughter Mary Elizabeth one Dollar also I give to my Daughter Mary Elizabeth one Dollar also I give to my son William Bishop to my Daughter Jane all alone to my Daughter Betty Bishop to my son Thomas Bishop to my son Lowry Bishop to my Daughter Rebecca Bishop to my Daughter Leah Bishop to my son Joseph Bishop to my son John Bishop and to my son Samuel Bishop All the personal part of my Estate which may remain at their Mothers Death to be equally Divided amongst them I also give to my son Samuel to my daughter Betty to my son Thomas and to my son Lowry to my daughter Rebecca to my daughter Leah to my son Joseph and to my son John Bishop each an equal share of all my Negroes which shall remain of my Estate at their Mothers Death also I give the tract of Land whereon I now reside to be equally Divided between my son Joseph Bishop and my son John Bishop at their Mothers Death and I do hereby nominate and appoint my Beloved son Lowry Bishop my Executor of this my last Will and Testament Given under my hand and seal the day and Date above written
